OTTAWA, Ont. (AP) — Conditions in western Canada indicate the probability that the wheat crop this year may be one of the largest in history, according to estimates received here by the dominion government.

SHORTAGE OF WATER FACED

UNION, (Special)—Union, as well as other towns, is having the shortage of water since the flow in Catherine Creek has gone down so much during the last two weeks. Although there has been plenty of water up to the very mouth in view of the probable lack of a sufficient pressure to cause a fire, has ordered that no irrigating shall be done from open hose or after eight o'clock of an evening. There is also a report that the water is being contaminated above the intake by the presence of a dead animal in the stream and this is likewise being looked after by the city officials.
