**WALLOWA LAKE  
GIVEN PRAISE**

Editor's Note—The following was written following the Fourth of July visit of the Portland Advertising Club caravan to Eastern Oregon and Wallowa Lake.

Much has been said and written about Oregon's beauties, its opportunities for outdoor sport and recreation, yet the trip to Wallowa Lake over the week end was a demonstration of a most practical kind that probably 50 per cent of our own people have but a limited and superficial knowledge of these attractions. Nearly 100 people joined in this caravan and had a most delightful and wonderful trip. It was a remarkable thing that of the people who took this outing not 10 percent of them had ever seen Wallowa. At least 75 percent of the people had never been in this section of Oregon and were, therefore, ignorant of the country between here and Wallowa and of the fascination of the beauties of the lake itself.

If the Portland Advertising club

wanted any justification for its enterprise and for the time devoted to organizing and making successful this caravan, it is certainly in the facts just related. If the people of Portland and Oregon are to appreciate the magnificent scenery and the almost unlimited facilities for spending a vacation outdoors in their own state they must see it. The fact is often overlooked that it is of just as much importance from a dollar standpoint that the people of Oregon spend their vacations in Oregon as it is to bring people from the outside to spend their vacations here.

**Moonlight Scene Wonderful**  
Wallowa was just an illustration. When this caravan of nearly 30 ears with their brilliant headlights circled the magic water of wonderful Wallowa in the clear moonlight of a perfect summer night, the caravan and its reflections in the lake being visible alike to its members and to the hundreds of people already at Wallowa who were enjoying within the shadows of Eagle Top and its companion peaks at the head of the lake, it was a most beautiful and entrancing scene, and the next morning to awaken and step out in this perfect gem of Oregon scenery by the side of the winding lake (terrain with a background of snow-capped, verdure-clad mountains, and stretching out in front of them the silvery waters of the lake, with the reflections of the rising sun, was an experience and a delight that will never be forgotten. From that moment Wallowa was "sold" to every member of the party.

**Scene One of Many**  
It has been said that Wallowa was just an example of Oregon scenery, one of the hundreds of resorts that are dotted all over the state. Those of us who have had the opportunity of visiting various parts of Oregon know there are other resorts, fortunately not of the same character, each different and yet with an appeal distinctly and entirely its own. They need not be enumerated here; in fact, it would be impossible to do so, but when we think of Crater Lake, Diamond Lake, Klamath Lake, the Oregon Caves, our magnificent ocean front and seashore, our rivers and streams and forests, our mountain ranges and peaks—Hood, McLoughlin, Jefferson, Three Sisters and the Coast range, what a wealth of natural scenery and opportunities for recreation there are in the state of Oregon in which our people may spend their vacations year after year, without visiting the same resort twice.

It is obvious that if these places are so wonderful, so interesting, so entertaining and so pleasing to our own people where we are familiar with scenery on a grand and majestic scale, they must appeal to the people of the east and south. The value of this great outdoors is incalculable from a recreational standpoint, but much more so as a magnet to draw permanent residents from all parts of the world to Oregon, as a land in which there are not only opportunities in business, in industry, in professions, in agriculture and horticulture, but as a most favored land in which to live and to raise families. We must estimate the value of Oregon's scenery not only from an economic standpoint, but from its influence in contributing to the joy of living which after all is the one greatest blessing that can be experienced by humanity.

**Wallowa Easily Reached**  
It was a revelation to these hard-hearted, practical business men of Portland to realize that this gem of Oregon scenery could be reached if necessary by a 14-hour drive from the city of Portland, save some of the finest highways in the United States. **U. S. Fleet to Disburse \$2,000,000 in Australia**

HONOLULU (AP)—The cargo of \$2,000,000 in gold which the United States fleet is taking to Australia, to pay the men and defray some of the expenses of re-fueling and re-provisioning, will be transferred bodily to the Australian government in return for Australian gold coinage at an ounce-for-ounce rate.

The American money then will be melted down and transferred into Australian coinage. The American government will pay a mintage fee of three pence an ounce, but will save \$30,000 in exchange on the deal, naval officers estimate. If American dollars were exchanged for Australian currency, the rate would be approximately \$4.91 to the pound, while the present ounce-for-ounce arrangement plus the small mintage charge results in a saving both to Australia and the United States. It was pointed out.

The gold arrived here from the mainland aboard the transport Chantant, and \$1,200,000 was transferred to the flagship Callifornia of the battle fleet, the remaining \$800,000 to the U. S. S. Omaha, flagship of the destroyer squadrons.

It is expected that the disbursements of the American fleet in both pay and payment for supplies will exceed the \$2,000,000 considerably, but such excess will be covered in the usual manner of exchange.
