### Road Improvement Program Being Carried Out in Brazil

BELLE HORIZONTE, Brazil. (AP)—A boom has struck the development of state highways in the state of Minas Geraes. The head of the highway commission reports that public expenditures for good road during 1924 totaled \$350,000 for 1925 will require an additional \$500,000. If completed according to present plans, the state highway system will include 8,500 miles of good roads. The state has a population of 4,000,000.

No few are the good roads in Minas Geraes that it has been impossible to motor from Belle Horizonte to the capital to any reliable road. Three roads are being worked at present, one heading towards the cocoa district of Brazil and the other two towards Rio de Janeiro.

### Helsingfors Opera Loses Money

HELSINGFORS (AP)—This year's season of the Helsingfors opera has come to an abrupt close because of a deficit of \$20,000. Despite an annual government subsidy of \$60,000 Finnish grapes and generous public support there has been a deficit the last few seasons.

### Sister Mary Says:

Irresistible—Blackberries, cereal, thin cream, crisp bacon, creamed potatoes, bran muffins, milk, coffee.

Lutcheon—Potato ball salad, tomatoed muffins, fruit jelly with whipped cream, plain cake, milk, tea.

Dinner—Lead watermelon cubes, broiled swordfish, cucumber sauce, baked potato croquette, lima beans, head lettuce with Russian dressing, whole wheat bread, cherry pie, milk, coffee.

The cucumber sauce, salad dressing and pie are taboo for juniors under six years of age. The beans should be mashed with a fork and the fish carefully flaked to remove all bones.

Potato ball salad is a bit out of the ordinary and most attractive to serve.

Potato Ball Salad  
Two large potatoes, 1 scant teaspoon mustard, 1-2 teaspoons salt, 3 tablespoons olive oil, 1 tablespoon tarragon vinegar, 3 hard-boiled eggs, few drops onion juice, 1 teaspoon anchovy sauce.

Boil potatoes until tender and put through a ricer. Season with mustard and salt. Rub eggs thru a sieve or flour. Add to potato mixture and beat in oil and vinegar and onion juice. Mix well and stir in anchovy sauce. When firm enough to handle shape into small balls. Chill and serve on a bed of lettuce with a mild cooked salad dressing.

The lecturer takes as her model of those indefatigable stateswomen placed in large shops to interest the patron by in some special article. Assembled upon a table in front of her are her "beauty products," or samples of nature's vanity box.

"No dressing table is complete without rouge these days," says the lecturer, "but the best kind consists of creamed carrots, which we call nature's own paint or complexion brush. Eat them cooked or raw. No matter how tender or delicate your skin, you can use yellow carrots cooked in milk twice a week. By mixing these two colors within the body, a promoting color will appear upon the cheeks of almost any person whose health is in any way normal."

(Continuing on the question of the complexion the lecturer goes on to say: "If you are pale and sallow, try our highly recommended skin softener, an apple hanging from the bough of the fruit tree. ### Samar Twins Spurn Vaudeville Proposal from New York Firm

MANILA, P. I. (AP)—A letter addressed to "Manila, Cuba" recently was received by Teodoro Yungco, former resident commissioner at Washington and guardian of the Samar Twins, regarding a contract which a New York City firm of vaudeville managers and producers desires to sign with the twins.

Although the vaudeville managers offered a large weekly salary for the services of the twins, Mr. Yungco declined to entertain the proposal. Some years ago he found the twins in a side show of a circus in the United States and brought them back to their native land.

### Deaths in Hawaii Revive Old Poison Fish Traditions

HONOLULU, (AP)—The death recently of two Chinese, which was attributed to the eating of the fresh puffer or balloon fish, has caused a debate as to whether the fish, a fairly common variety in Hawaiian waters, is poisonous in itself or became so through poisonous seaweed eaten by the fish, or through improper methods of preparation. The occurrence also has revived some interesting legends among the Hawaiians.

The Queen's Hospital, in a bulletin issued after exhaustive examination, declares that the six balloon fish, which were supposed to have caused the death of the two Chinese were not poisonous. The bulletin explains further that it is possible that these fish at certain times or places eat a poisonous seaweed. The hospital points out also that there is a variety of the fish, comparatively rare, which is poisonous, with a secretion similar to the poison of certain toad stools, and that on the island of Molokai it is a well known fact that certain fish, such as the ordinary harmless ulua, if taken on one side of the island, are poisonous, but if caught elsewhere, are wholesome food. Theullet is said to be poisonous in Molokai waters at certain times of the year, and to produce choking, dizziness and terrifying dreams.

The legend is that certain gods came at various seasons to live at the seashore, and while they remained on the shore of a certain bay the fish were poisonous to man. "The true explanation," say the hospital chemists, "is probably that at certain times and places the fish eat poisonous food."

Hawaiians, however, assert that there is no poisonous seaweed in Hawaiian waters.

### Germans Will Build Tannenberg Memorial

KORNISBERG (AP)—An imposing monument to commemorate the Hindenburg victory at Tannenberg is to be erected on the site of the battlefield. It will surround a smaller monument dedicated to the memory of the old Hindenburg regiment which now marks the scene of the battle.

The plan for the new monument was selected in a contest and was proposed by two brothers, Walter and Johannes Kroszner. It will consist of an octagonal wall, 12 feet high and 245 feet in diameter, to encircle the present monument. Massive square towers 49 feet in height are to be placed at each of the eight corners. A memorial hall for each regiment which took part in the battle will be provided and the ground floors of seven of the towers will be equipped as museums containing relics of the battle. The upper stories of the towers are to be arranged as living quarters for Tannenberg veterans who will be caretakers and act as guides of the battlefield.
