IMPORTS SHOW BIG INCREASE

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—According to figures compiled by the Traffic Department of the Port of Portland imports from foreign countries into Portland for the first six months of 1925 amounted to 62,872 tons. This is an increase over the figures for the first half of 1924 which were 56,259 tons. Imports into Portland have been increasing each year, being 55,549 tons in 1923, 59,102 tons in 1924 and 109,275 tons in 1925.

The month of June was a particularly good month for imports with 16,993 tons. Large items of import during this month were cement, 2648 tons; hemp with 2226 tons; copra 1443 tons; coconut oil 1119 tons; silver sand amounting to 695 tons and peanuts amounting to 267 tons. During this month some of the smaller items of imports were 54 tons of denatured alcohol from the Philippines. Total imports of this commodity for the first half of the year amounted to 141 tons. This is a new item of import direct into Portland. Also during the month of June there were imported 59 tons of hen albumin and hen yolk from China. These are the first imports of this kind this year.

Human hair in the amount of 17,000 pounds was imported during the month of May and during June 87,569 pounds of horse hair was imported from China. From Java via China we received large quantities of paraffin wax which is so much in demand during the home canning season. During June 61 tons entered and during the year so far, 210 tons have been brought in.

China Sends Bristles.

A shipment of Fuller's earth amounting to 60,000 pounds was brought in during June from the United Kingdom. Bristles amounting to 72 tons entered from China. These will be used in the manufacture of brushes. Cassia in the amount of 13 tons entered during June and 22 tons during the first six months of this year are bean-cake amounting to 1425 tons, coconut oil in the amount of 5771 tons, coal and coke amounting to 1258 tons, copra amounting to 5,877 tons, corn from Manchuria amounting to 2941 tons, hemp amounting to 6258 tons, iron and steel amounting to 7839 tons, sugar amounting to 1669 tons, from Belgium we have received 567 tons of glass and from China 2921 tons of wool. Most of this wool however is transhipped to eastern United States ports.

Peanut Shipments Heavy.

Shipments of peanuts have been particularly heavy this year with 2792 tons entered during the first six months. The big month of exports was May when 10,000 tons and Mrs. W. W. Murphy and Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Bell.

try for peanuts was May when 1922 tons were brought in. Some of these peanuts are kept in Portland in storage at municipal terminal No. 4 and will be shipped from there to various interior American cities.

An interesting item connection with Portland's imports is that the largest tonnage this year originated in Belgium. This consists of steel, cement, glass, coal and coke and silver sand. The total amount of imports from this country was 18,829 tons.

Philippines Second.

The Philippine Islands were second with 17,022 tons. Imports from this country were not as heavy as usual due to the smaller imports of copra. This was caused by the fact that the Portland Vegetable Oil Mills has been closed during the rebuilding. Imports of hemp have not been as heavy but the other items have been greater.

From China imports amounted to 14,250 tons. This is greater than

for last year. The larger items are bean-cake, bristles, peanuts, wool, straw-bale, corn, cotton, seeds, hides with many other items making up the balance.

Germany to Pay Former Ascari Troops of East African Colony

BERLIN (AP)—After waiting several years, Germany has been granted permission to pay the former Ascari Troops of German East Africa for the last year of the World War. Until now, England, as the mandatory power of the former German colony, has refused to permit Germany to pay the former colonial troops.

The amount involved is 12,000,000 marks, approximately \$3,000,000, and will be paid to the ascari by British officials with two German civilians present.

EXPLODES MYTH
