BERLENBACH MATCHED TO MEET DELANEY IN AUGUST

NEW YORK (AP)—Paul Berlenbach of Astoria, N. Y., world's light heavyweight champion, will meet his long time enemy, Jack Delaney, of Bridgeport, Conn., in a 15-round title match at the Yankee stadium August 23, Tex Rickard announced Wednesday. Supporting the championship match Berlenbach is expected to match Mike McTigue, former world's light heavyweight champion, with Jimmy Statters of Buffalo and Tommy Loughran of Philadelphia with Tiger Flowers of Atlanta, in two 20-rounders.

Delaney, on the night of March 24, 1924, knocked out Berlenbach at Madison Square Garden at a time when the latter was traveling at the height of one of the most impressive knockout careers in the history of the title game. It was the first knockout Berlenbach had suffered and he himself had piled up a total of 23 consecutive knockouts, numbering among his victims some of the best middleweights.

Jack Dempsey Seeking Several Big Battles

SALT LAKE (AP)—Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion, accompanied by his wife, formerly Estelle Taylor, arrived here late Wednesday from New York on route to Los Angeles.

Dempsey's hurried call to the Pacific coast is the result of his decision to wind up his business affairs with Jack Kearns, his manager, and to control the reins himself. He said he would discuss matters with Kearns and that he hoped to arrive at a satisfactory agreement.

"My contract with Kearns runs for some time yet," the champion said, "and I will make no effort to have the contract severed. Kearns will receive his full commission from all my earnings as stipulated in the contract, but when this contract expires I shall do my own managing."

After his business is finished on the coast Dempsey said he would return to New York and if it is deemed necessary, go before the New York boxing commission to satisfy such demands as that body should insure the Wills bout for the future.

The champion firmly realizes that he is out of condition and for this reason is not willing to make the mistake of entering the ring when not at his best. That he regards Wills as the most logical contender for the heavy-weight crown and that he esteems his ability foremost among the heavy-weight contenders, is shown by his habit once that he be allowed several bouts to "tune him up" to the proper condition.

"I have signed to meet Wills and it is only a question of time until that fight takes place. However, I shall be in the best of condition and I shall not be hurried into the fight until I think I have attained that goal. A Wills fight for this year is out of the question, but I shall take on someone probably in September."

Dempsey will leave for Los Angeles at 2:30 Thursday afternoon.

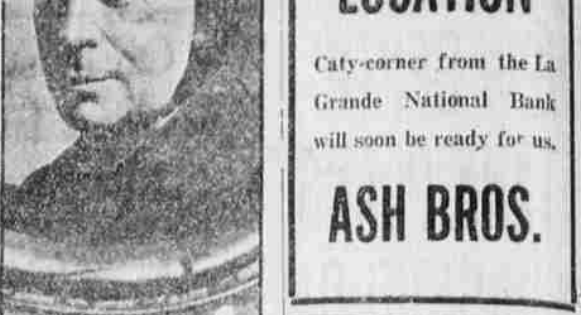
