Catholic School to Be Erected in China

BEATTY, Pa. (AP)—Survey of conditions preparatory to the establishment of a Catholic educational institution in China, under the supervision of St. Vincent Arch-Bishop here has been completed by the Rt. Rev. Anselmus Stehls, Order of St. Benedict, who recently returned from Peking. He spent several months in China, at the direction of Pope Pius XI, making the survey.

The project was started seven years ago when Vincent Yink, a Chinese educator, appealed to Pope Benedict XV for assistance in establishing a university in Peking but nothing definite resulted. With the election of Pope Pius XI the matter was again considered and it was referred to the entire American-Catholic congregation believing the undertaking would be too large to be launched by any single abbey.

The question was considered at the twenty-first general chapter of the American-Catholic congregation, at the Abbey of Saint Procopius, Lisle, Ill., in August, 1923. A favorable vote was returned and the project was entrusted to St. Vincent's Arch-Bishop.

The tentative curriculum would include theology and philosophy; letters, Chinese and European; natural science; social science and history; and mining and engineering. A preparatory school may be included in the plans and other additions made to meet local educational needs. The site for the institution has been obtained and it is expected that construction work will be undertaken within a short time.

Extend Italian Work In the Dark Continent

ROME (AP)—Encouraged by the remarkable archeological discovery made by Italians at Lepcis Magna on 23 Sabratha in Northern Africa, a party of Italian scientists led by Dr. Ettore Ghislanzoni of the Roman National Museum, intend to begin large scale excavations at Cyrenus in the Italian colony of Cyrenaica.

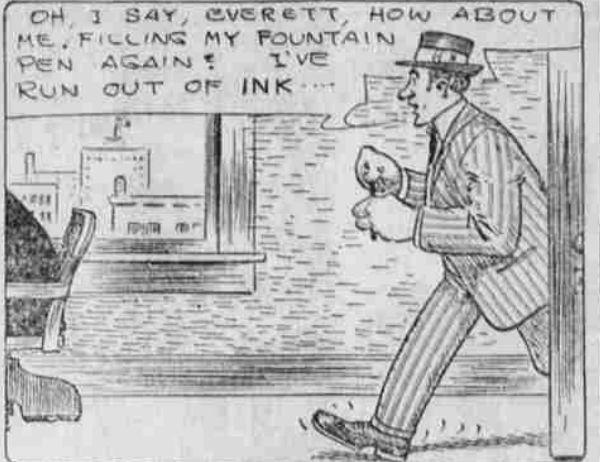
Cyrenus, which has already given to the world the marvellous Cyrenus Amphitheatre now in the National Museum in Rome, was the oldest and largest Greek colony in Africa. It was built in the seventh century before Christ on the highest part of western Libya fronting the coast of Marsa Sura, where the ancient port of Apollonia was situated.

Excavations which were carried on in Cyrenus ten years ago showed that the ancient city contained in excellent state of preservation relics of all of the epochs of antiquity, especially the Hellenic and the Roman. During the Roman era, the city was the capital of Crete and Cyrenus.
