Billy Evans Says

JONES GREATER STYLIST
Several years ago, just prior to the national open golf championships, I heard the great Walter Hagen remark of Bobby Jones: "Jones is the greatest stylist in the game. He is five strokes better than the field."

That was a rather surprising statement coming from such a wonderful golfer as Hagen. It struck me that Hagen was paying Jones a rather exaggerated compliment, since the cream of the golfing world was in evidence.

When Jones tied MacFarlane in the last national open, I recalled what Hagen had said about him.

PRaise FROM HAGEN

New Hagen knows his golf. As I pointed out in my last four open championships and marveled at the showing made by Jones I realized there was little of the exaggeration when Hagen said Jones was five strokes better than the field.

In the last four years Jones has never finished out of second place. Golf stars are not supposed to be consistent but Jones appears to be one of the rare exceptions.

For five years Jones has been a jewel of consistency. He was four strokes away in 1920, his first flub at the open. While in three of his last four championships the Atlanta has either tied for the title or won a stroke away.

Walter Hagen's high estimate of the golfing ability of Bobby Jones was well deserved if you believe in figures. He sure appears to have an edge on the field.

VEES GOING BIG

The old adage in sport that youth will be served don't appear to apply to major league pitching.

Veteran pitchers are carrying the burden for Manager Stanley Hays at Washington. His three big winners are Walter Johnson, "Dutch" Reuther and Stanley Coveleski.

It is the same with most of the other clubs; the effective pitchers are twentysix who have seen years of service. Here and there a rookie is going big but he is the exception.

Philadelphia, being lower in the standing at the time of the asking of waivers, got him. Quinn, in his debut as a member of Mark's club, proceeded to beat Detroit, 4-1, on five hits.

Connie Mack appears to have made a wise move in getting the veteran Quinn to bolster up his faltering staff. Quinn is far from through.

U. S. HAS HALF OF TELEPHONES

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Statistics compiled here recently by the Southern California Telephone Company show that the United States, with approximately 16,000,000 instruments, leads the world in telephone, 53 percent are in the United States, 26 percent in the countries of Europe and 11 percent in countries of other continents.

In European countries the average number of telephones is 12 for each 1,000 inhabitants, while in the United States the figures show that there are 121 telephones for every thousand.

The statistics revealed that in cities in the United States of 50,000 population or over the average number of instruments was 177 for each 1,000 persons. Omaha, Neb., with 284 per 1,000 is second. Pasadena, Cal., with 275; Des Moines, Ia., 267; Lincoln, Neb., 242; and San Francisco with 239 rank third, fourth and fifth in the order named.

Chicago ranks thirteenth with 224 telephones per 1,000 population; Boston is twenty-fourth, with 222; and New York City, despite the fact that it has more instruments than Berlin, London, Paris, Liverpool, Rome, Antwerp, Brussels and Shanghai combined, ranks in forty-third place.

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Dog Races Help Drive Mischief from Minds Of Idaho Youngsters

ASHTON, Ida. (AP)—Protection officers have no trouble with incorrigible children in Northern Idaho. Since the Ashton Dog Derby has become such an important sporting event and junior races have been included in the program every child more than six years old in all the Northwest within hundreds of miles of Yellowstone National Park is so busy following dogs that there is no time for mischief. Boys and girls alike are breaking all available "winks" to harness and dreaming of the day when they will be Smokey Gaston, or Toot Kents or Oloof Zorn.

Ted Kent won the Ashton Dog Derby last Washington's Birthday. The previous year Oloof Zorn who was only 15 years old, was the winner in the twenty-five mile race. Smokey Gaston won for several years and always figured so prominently in the contest that he is the ideal of all youthful dog-racers.

Next year's derby, which will be held on February 22 as usual, will be the greatest ever held. The capital prize will be \$1,500, an amount more this year, and larger prizes are also to be offered in the junior races.

The race of the dog team to come last year with a view to relieve the diphtheria epidemic has intensified the general interest in dog racing and shown how useful the dog teams are in snowbound districts where other forms of transportation are limited in extreme weather. Teams with from five to seven dogs compete in the main event at Ashton, while the junior races are for single dogs or dogs driven in pairs, and have become a very interesting feature of the derby. Thousands of visitors from all parts of the Western United States and Canada attended the derby this year, special trains or Pullman cars having come from Boise, Salt Lake and Butte with visitors who participated in the carnival which included all sorts of winter sports.
