Grandeur of Ballet Suffers Little From Russ Revolution

MOSCOW (AP)—The Russian ballet stands in "the front row" among the pleasing things of life that have survived the Bolshevik revolution. It is a form of entertainment that brightens up the otherwise somber picture which the visitor finds in Soviet Russia. As an art the ballet has suffered but little as a result of the great 1917 upheaval which profoundly affected every form of social popularity, the Bolsheviks have fostered and subsidized the ballet making an earnest effort to maintain it as its old standard.

Although the ballet was developed and perfected in France, it finds its highest expression in Russia. For 200 years the Russians have concentrated on this form of dancing, with the result that the Russian performance and "ballet d'opera" have no equal anywhere in the world. It is true that Soviet Russia wanted to abolish the ballet, but the revolutionaries have not done so. The state ballet school in Moscow is kept up to the highest high standards and traditional standards of the world.

The Russian ballet school is one of the most interesting and fascinating places in Russia. It is the national "nursery" of the Russian ballet. Here boys and girls, from seven to sixteen years old, are trained in all the graceful motions of the body and feet. They are mostly the children of professional or theatrical people. The ballet is considered a "divine" institution. Therefore, it does not attract the children of the proletariat.

It requires from ten to 15 years to make a perfect ballet dancer. Pupils begin from three to six years of age to train and practice. Even long after a pupil has become a two-act dancer, he or she must go to the ballet school every day. Madame Goussier, Russian premier ballerina, who is now 42 years old, is a notable example of long preparation and perfection in technique. Although long past what is generally regarded as the dancing age, she performs with all the grace and rhythm of a girl of 17. She is, in fact, a perfect example of the Russian ballet school's training.

All the popular houses and performances of the world are "The Sleeping Beauty," "The Swan Lake," "Coppelia," and "The Nutcracker." The latter is the most popular of the Russian ballets, and the one which has been most widely imitated in other countries.
