MALMÖ, Sweden (AP)—A daily aerial passenger service has been established between Malmö and Copenhagen, Berlin, Amsterdam, Paris and London.

## Sister Mary Says:

Breakfast—Orange juice, broiled bacon, scrambled eggs, graham toast, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Vegetable salad, toasted cheese sandwiches, cherry pudding, milk, tea.

Dinner—Veal cutlets, scalloped potatoes, buttered beans with greens, molded spinach salad, pine apple sherbet, sponge cake, whole wheat bread, milk, coffee.

If the vegetables are carefully chosen and combined with a simple French dressing a child of four may be served the salad.

The pudding suggested in luncheon menu should not be served to children under six years of age. A dish of stewed fruit and a plain cookie should be substituted.

**Cherry Pudding**  
One cup stoned cherries, 1 cup sugar, 2 cups flour, 3-4 cup milk, 1 tablespoon melted butter, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon soda, 1-2 teaspoons cream of tartar, 1-2 teaspoon salt. Beat eggs until light. Beat in the sugar. Mix and sift flour, soda, cream of tartar and salt. Add alternately with milk to first mixture. Beat in melted butter. Put cherries into a buttered baking dish and bring slowly to the boiling point. Spread butter over cherries and bake 45 minutes in a moderate oven. Serve warm with sugar and cream.

**Father Rescued by Girl**  
THE DALLIES, Ore.—Details of a drowning and the heroic rescue by a girl of her father, which occurred at McClure's lake, west of Rowena, was received here. C. C. Sparks, 25, of Forest Grove, lost his life when he was stricken by a cramp while swimming in the lake. T. E. Morgenson, with whom Sparks had been swimming, plunged into the water, but Sparks sank before the rescuer could reach his side.

Morgenson was unable to regain the shore and was rescued by his daughter, Lucy, who swam from the opposite shore of the lake just in time to keep her father from going under. Sparks is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Levi Sparks of Forest Grove.

**Apple Tonnage Lower.**  
HOOD RIVER, Ore.—The apple crop of the White Salmon valley comprising the districts of Skamania and Kluckwal counties, will reach about 450 to 500 cars, according to Fred Baker. The 1924 tonnage reached an approximate 600 cars.

The White Salmon valley pear tonnage will be light this season, less than 75 cars. The Mount Adams Farm company, which has the largest individual block of D'Anjou pears in the country, expects a yield of about 30 cars, less than half a crop.
