Since time immemorial there has obtained the custom of indicating one's wealth in land by the number of pillars on his front porch. Every pillar stands for one "halt," or "hauf," an old German designation which is equivalent to 20 acres.

Great Crane Installed

MILL CITY, Ore.—The huge new wooden crane being installed by the Hammond Lumber company, which has been in the course of construction for several months, was placed into service Monday. The crane has a five-foot capacity at the end of an 80-foot boom, and is one of the first of this kind to be installed on the coast. It will be used for loading heavy timber onto cars.

Zoppot, Free City of Danzig Becomes Monte Carlo Rival

ZOPPOT, Free City of Danzig. (AP)—This fashionable watering place on the Baltic is rapidly acquiring the name of "Monte Carlo of the North." From all over Europe, especially from Danzig, Poland, and Germany, people bent on playing roulette or бирингал flick hitler to indulge in games of chance. The fact that the Zoppot bathing beach is one of the finest along the southern shores of the Baltic affords a ready excuse for people to come here "for their health."

Theoretically, gambling is forbidden in the Free City of Danzig. The owners of the beautiful up-to-date Casino hold no concession from the state for conducting these games of chance. However, the Free City is vitally interested in the income, for 40 percent of the gross income from the gambling tables goes to the city of Danzig, and to the other municipalities within its confines. From the remaining 60 percent the owners must defray all running expenses.

Every attempt to get at theoretical revenue obtained from the Casino meets with an evasive reply on the part of Danzig's officials. One is merely told that the proceeds cannot be used for general purposes but must be devoted to social welfare. Such a profit must be considerable, however, as is judged from the fact that the Casino, which, since the closing is increasing its share of the net profit in a magnificent new hotel, facing the ocean and located a short distance from the villa formerly inhabited by the German crown prince.

Japanese Propose Trade Gaily

TOKYO, (AP)—A bill which would handle the Russian Japanese import and export trade has been proposed by Viscount Satomura Goto, according to the vernaculars. It is said the proposed bill would be capitalized at 150,000,000 yen. The trade with Russia, according to Viscount Goto's scheme, would be handled by the Japanese and the Soviet Bureau of Trade. The bill would also look after any concessions granted by Russia to Japanese.

THREE KILLED DURING HOLDUP

CHICAGO, (AP)—Four masked robbers who attempted to find on the Drake hotel, situated on Lake Shore drive, yesterday, during tea hour Wednesday, precipitated a battle between robbers, hotel detectives and policemen that resulted in the death of two of the robbers and the hotel cashier.

Another of the robbers was captured after a thrilling battle in the hotel kitchen and the fourth escaped in an automobile left parking at the curb, with \$10,000 of the hotel's money snatched from the safe and all while bullets whizzed about his head.

The robbery, one of the most daring in many years, was perpetrated by men under the influence of narcotics, the police said, after examining the captured robber and questioning hotel employees, who described the holdup men as "either drunk or tipsy."

One of the holdup men was shot several miles from the hotel, after he had commandeered

a taxi, forced a woman from the car and commandeered the driver, at the point of a pistol, to speed away with him. The taxi driver wrecked his machine deliberately in order to allow pursuing policemen to overtake the robber.

Men Identified

The man who was captured gave his name as Jack Holmes, and said that he recently came here from New York. The robber killed in the taxi cab is said to be Eric Nelson, former employe of the hotel, and the man shot in front of the hotel was identified as "Tex" Curtis, who came here a few days ago from Sweetwater, Tex. The hotel cashier and head clerk, Frank Rodke, was shot in the abdomen and died later.

The holdup came shortly after 2 o'clock, at the height of the exclusive hotel's afternoon tea rush and while hundreds of guests and patrons thronged the building, while half a dozen park policemen were directly in front of the holdup or within half a block of it.

The four robbers entered the hotel, ascended to the mezzanine floor, where the cashier's cage is located, and after obtaining them-

selves at strategic points, suddenly donned masks and drew pistols confronting about 25 employes, mostly women, with orders to "hands up!" Two robbers guarded the employes, herded together, while two others ransacked the cashier's cage.

In one of the dead robber's pockets were found his black mask, his pistol, 55 cents, and a notebook containing several names. As a result of the addresses in the notebook, Margaret MacPherson, a waitress, was taken into custody for questioning, and others whose names were found were being sought.

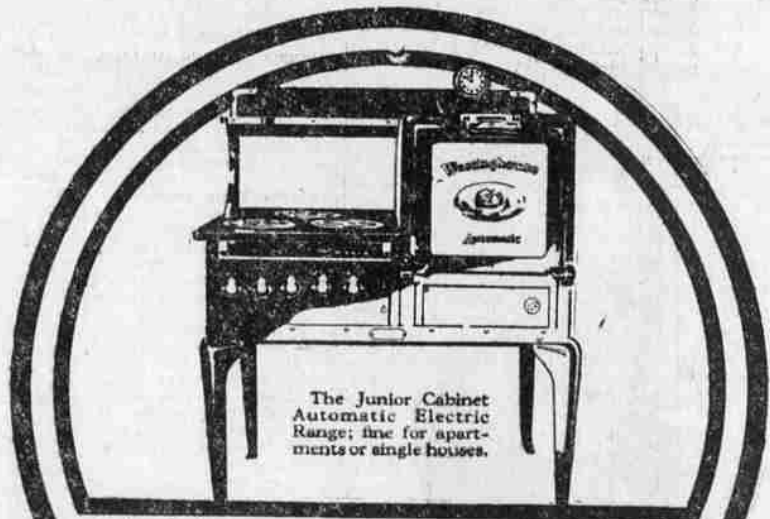
