Charles Paddock On Last Lap of His Tour

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP)—Charles Paddock, American sportsman, who is on a world tour, arrived here Wednesday from Helsinki, Finland.

Regarding the recent charges made in Germany concerning his amateur status and that of his companion, Loren Murchison, Paddock told the Associated Press he felt it was unnecessary to answer the German charges, as he had not violated rules.

"Immediately upon our return to the United States, Murchison and I will give the American Athletic Union a complete report," declared Paddock. "We have in no way violated either our own or international rules."

Paddock sails on the Arctik Saturday for New York. He will not compete again this year.

"Throughout the world tour we experienced a splendid spirit of sportsmanship everywhere except in Germany," said Paddock.

The American runner came to Stockholm from Helsinki, Finland, where he spent Tuesday night on a small island in the Baltic sea, from which point the plane continued its journey to Stockholm Wednesday morning.

Paddock and Murchison completed in the all-European field events in Berlin on June 21, after which charges were made that the two sprinters received money from sports promoters for their appearance. While Paddock went north to compete in the Baltic countries, Murchison went to England for the annual British A. A. Championships in which he was the outstanding star. The British authorities, however, withheld his medals because his amateur standing had been questioned in Germany.

Murchison already has denied that his amateur standing was jeopardized by his Berlin appearance, and has declared that he is content to leave the question to the official amateur athletic bodies of England and the United States.

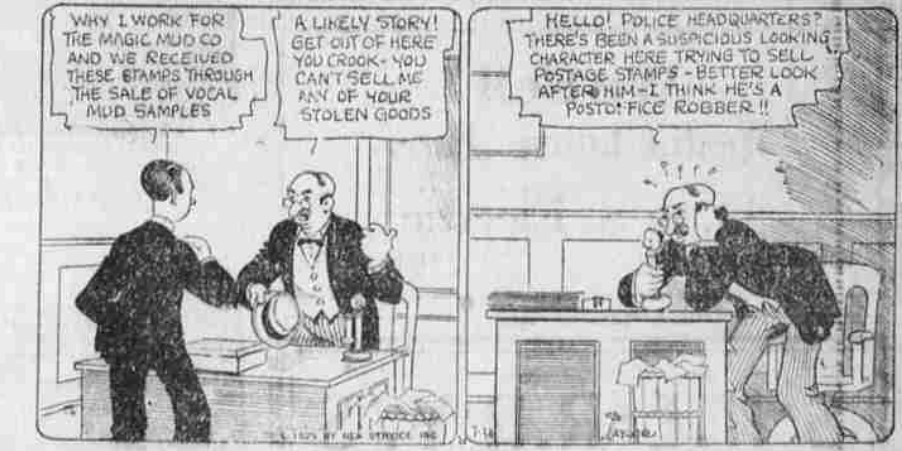
