DUCK FOREIGN TO DISTRICT

WALLOWA, Ore. (Special)—...many tests concerning the wild life of the mountains were indicated by Stanley Jewett of the Biological Survey, who returned last week from a trip through the high mountains of Wallowa county. The party consisting of himself and assistant, Elmer Williams and Deputy Game Warden, George Rogers, went up Bear Creek, passing Steamboat, Minam, and Mirror lakes and on over to Lake Ansel.

The most interesting scientific discovery of the trip was a Harlequin duck and a brood of young found at Fraser lake on the West Fork. This is the first record of this species nesting in Oregon. The bird is a little smaller than a teal, and presents a peculiar spotted plumage, with white feathers and bars in the plumage. The female has white cheeks.

Predatory animals are reported to be scarce in the mountains. No coyotes were found, and few bobcats. The poison campaign and government hunter have evidently been very effective. Bear have been causing the loss of sheep in the North Mountain meadows. Twenty-one sheep were killed a few weeks ago in that region, and Bert Serratt, the local government hunter, got into action, and after killing two of the offending animals, evidently stopped the trouble. Sheep killing bears are not common, but when one gets started, he does a lot of damage. It is usually the old animals with teeth worn down who get the blame. There is no bounty on bear and they are protected. As a rule they are not considered predatory animals, they get a taste for sheep blood.

Due to the big increase in the amount of business done at the local railroad station at Wallowa it has become necessary to add another clerk, J. Z. Herina, who arrived Friday from Pleasant Valley to take up his duties as second clerk. Wallowa now has the most employees in the depot of any station on the Branch Line. The Bowman-Hicks and general business now places Wallowa in the front as a shipping point.

With the death of John J. Murphy, Friday July 24, Wallowa lost one of its old and well liked citizens. Mr. Murphy was well known in both Union and Wallowa counties. Death came at 5:45 o'clock as the result of heart trouble with which he has been afflicted for some time. The funeral was held Wednesday at ten in the morning at the Catholic church at Wallowa. Interment was made in the local cemetery. The services were in charge of Father Ollthant.

own, Canada, August 11, 1867, being 62 years, 11 months and 14 days at the time of his death. He moved with his parents to Wisconsin when three years of age. He grew up at LaCrosse, Wisconsin, where he was employed in the lumbering industry. In August 1895, he married Miss Mary Bean who survives him. Twenty-four years ago he came west, and has spent most of the later part of his life in Union and Wallowa counties. He was associated with the Nibley-Minnaugh Lumber Company, during the entire of their operations in Wallowa County.

Chile Preparing Fine Reception for Prince

SANTIAGO, Chile, (AP)—Preparations are under way here for an elaborate program of entertainment for the Prince of Wales during his brief visit to Chile in September.

Arriving in Santiago from the Argentine frontier the royal visitor will find the city virtually on feet and with British and Chilean emblems on display everywhere. Some of the streets will be specially illuminated for the occasion. He will be called upon to review the Chilean fleet at Valparaiso, the military here and also the Chilean Boy Scout organizations. There will be a gala day at the races for the "Prince of Wales" trophy.

The British heir will have an opportunity to play a game of polo in Valparaiso and later will witness a display of Chilean horsemanship at a Bullfight. Another feature of his visit, according to present plans, will be the presentation of a collection of Aucanian jewels of pre-colonial days.

Two grand balls will be given in his honor, one by the government and another by the British residents in the republic. On the night of the Prince's arrival 115 huge bonfires, representing as many years of Chilean national life, will burn along the foothills of the Andes within easy visibility of Santiago.
