**NEW YORK (AP)**—The three of limitation which have produced first place struggles in two teams in both major leagues, were yielding slowly Sunday night to pressure from potential contenders in third place.

The Cincinnati Reds, scoring to eight straight victories last week, Sunday night were still in full cry after New York and Pittsburgh in the National.

Brooklyn Robins, ending possession of the third ranking in the Redland park, became wedged at the bottom of the first division by a three-game margin in spite of four triumphs out of six starts as the Cincinnati machine climbed to within five games of second place.

Chicago's threat in the American accomplished the double end of solidly establishing the "Colts" entry in third place and in forcing the champion Senators to remain content with second place.

The three-tiered chase for the third post between the White Sox, Tigers and Browns, after several weeks' duration, was abruptly terminated with the start of the Wally Pyburn, Detroit and St. Louis remaining deadlocked at fourth place, as they had been a week ago.

The lead in the National league underwent its ninth change since the first week in July, when the Giants Saturday trounced the Cardinals, while the Pirates craft sprang a leak on uncharted Philadelphia shoals. Two percentage points separated the vacillating leaders at the end of the week.

The week was one of comparative quiet all along the firing line, with second division teams in both circuits continuing to slide, contentedly along in groove that have occupied for several weeks.

The Philadelphia Athletics closed with a margin of one game and a half over the Senators, the same advantage they held a week ago, while Chicago, in third place, was still eight and one-half games behind the Harris team.

Sixth place Cleveland perked up slightly, while the New York Yankees too far ahead of Oakland Boston and too far behind the race to worry about the polar position, had occasion to speculate on the path of Manager Huggins' wedding and program.

O'Neill, veteran catcher, followed Everett Scott and Whitey Witt in taking departure from the club.

Philadelphia, St. Louis, Chicago and Boston showed no disposition to strike out for improved locations in the National standings.
