HIGHWAY DETOUR OPENS
SALEM, Ore.—Construction operations have made it necessary for the state highway commission to close the Pacific highway to traffic just north of Oakland Douglas county, during the hours 7:30 A. M. to 5:30 P. M. The detour will remain in effect approximately three weeks, members of the commission said.

A detour has been provided over what is known as the Cole hill or Goodrich road. This road leaves the Pacific highway four miles north of Oakland and connects with the highway in the city of Oakland. Traffic will be allowed to use the main highway after working hours.

Restoring of Mines in Russia Restores Hope of Old Order

LONDON, (AP)—Reports in mining circles here, indicate that some approach to the old economic order in Russia is gradually being made. In connection it was announced recently that the properties of the British Spassky Copper Mine, Limited, which were taken over by the Soviet authorities, were being operated privately again, and that a new issue of capital is contemplated at an early date to be offered pro rata to the shareholders.

This follows the announcement a few weeks ago of the Lima Company, which American capital is heavily interested, that it had again been given control of its properties, which cover thousands of acres.

LEIPZIG, (AP)—For the first time since the founding of the Gewandhaus orchestra in 1781 a visiting orchestra, the Saxonian state, will be included in the season's program.
