Army Veteran Holds Gen. Reno Blameless in Custer Massacre

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP)—Nick Iino, a veteran of the battle of Little Big Horn, June 25, 1876, holds that the massacre of Custer's command by Sioux Indians was due to disobedience of orders and "poor judgment" on the part of General Custer and not to the failure of General Reno to reach him in time with reinforcements.

Mr. Iino, who served eight years in the United States army, is now 74 years of age and a resident of this city.

"Reno has been blamed for being lax, cowardly, dilatory and everything else," Mr. Iino said, "but it was impossible for Reno to reach the scene of conflict in time to participate. Custer himself was breaking an understanding that the pitched battle was to be June 26. He fought it at day earlier, before either the detachment of troops under Reno or Colonel Gibbons could come up, and lost."

"I remember that we met Custer June 22, 1876, on the Yellowstone River, opposite the mouth of the Rosebud. We had just come from Fort Ellis and were camped on the north side when Custer, riding from Fort Lincoln, showed up on the south. That same day he received orders from General Terry to proceed up the Rosebud toward the Indian camp. The orders specified that the final engagement was to take place June 26, when all forces would concentrate on the camp."

"My detachment, under Colonel Gibbons, crossed the Yellowstone below the mouth of the Big Horn June 24 and camped on the east side of the Big Horn. I, Troop, under Captain Tyler, which was in advance of Gibbons' command, was first to see the Indians, and returned to report. We camped on the Little Big Horn June 25, just 10 miles from the battle."

Menjou, as Walter Grenham, however, manages to convince Jane (Aileen Pringle) that he is sincere when she accepts him, only to break the engagement when she sees him in the arms of a married woman, Betty King. Miss Rich has this role. In reality, it is Betty and not Grenham who does all the pursuing and the thoughtless girl, never thinking for a moment that she is endangering her own happiness with her husband, whom she loves almost spoils things for Grenham and Jane.

In a climax that piles laugh upon laugh, Menjou proves that women in general interest him no longer—that he has eyes for but one.

Kenneth MacKenna plays John King, Betty's true husband, who goes grinding for his rival, whom he believes to be one of his

wife's many Cuban admirers. In reality, Menjou is the main. Some great laughs here.

Ann Pennington and Kitty Kelly are but two of the other big names in the cast.
