### Mayor Shank, Unable To Decide on Future, Soon to Quit Office

INDIANAPOLIS (AP)—Law Shank, who has combined an intermittent career of public advocacy with a successful horse racing and operation of a storage plant, will retire again to private life at the end of this year.

where his second term as mayor of Indianapolis expired. Shank has not decided whether he will either back onto the auction block or resume management of his storage plant. His friends say he no longer has any inclination for the race track, and he has said he will not be turned back to the stage, where as a professional humorist, he attracted attention throughout the country some years ago.

His present objective is to cap his career as mayor with the purchase of the 45-acre Laurel Hill estate and mansion near the city for a municipal park and country club. The property, valued at more than one million dollars, belonged to Houghton Fletcher, Indianapolis capitalist, and is now in the hands of trustees. Shank, conceiving the idea of acquiring it for a city playground, recently inserted page advertisements in Indianapolis newspapers urging citizens to visit it. Thousands of residents inspected the estate on the day set, but much opposition has arisen to purchase or lease of the estate by the city.

Since the day Shank decided suddenly, over a card table in the back room of a saloon, to run for the mayoralty of Indiana's metropolis, he has kept the city and state in the limelight and he has become a notable character. He has been unusually well informed on all branches of city government, and has shown aptitude for business administration, and he has been indomitably persistent in attainment of his municipal objectives.

Shank expired last year to the republican gubernatorial nomination but was beaten. He must in direct defeat again in the city primaries last May when Ralph Lemke, who had Shank's support for the mayoralty, lost the republican nomination to John L. Duval, present county treasurer, leaving a breach in republican party ranks which has not yet healed completely.

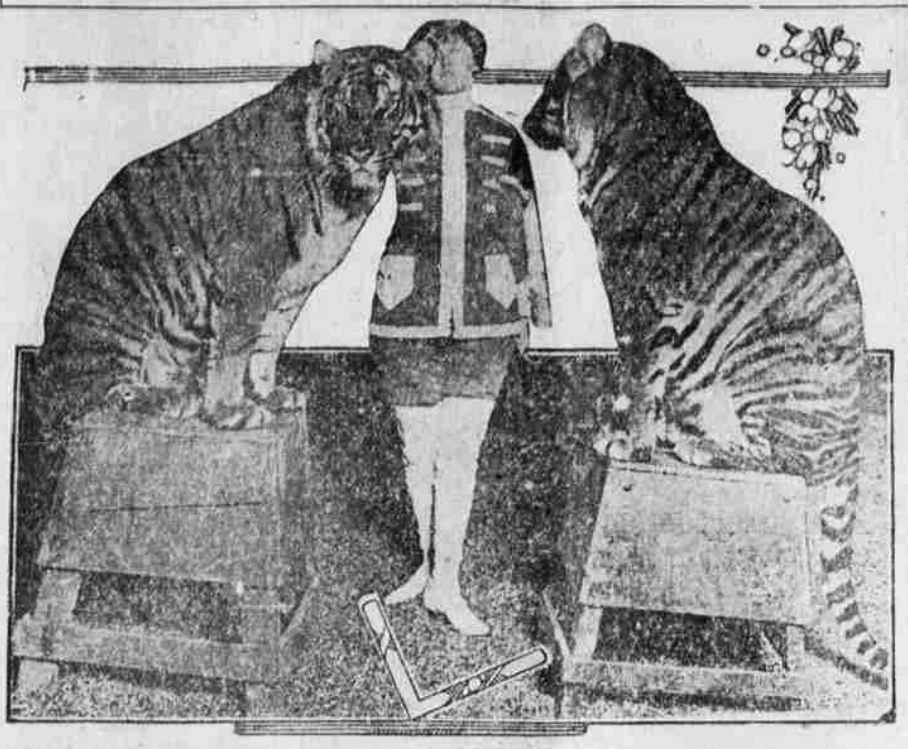

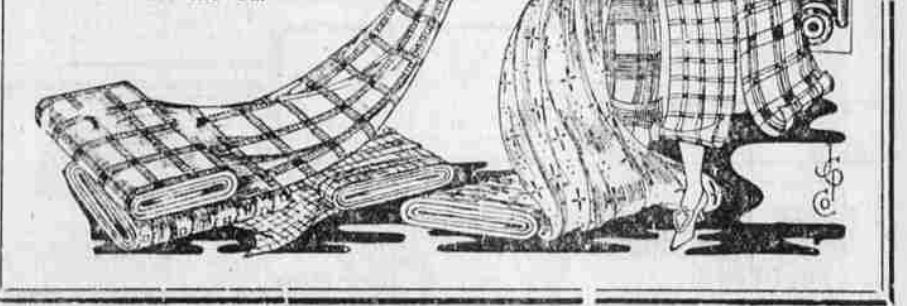

To Whom It May Concern: WHEREAS, The Trout and other fish inhabiting the waters of Fanno Creek, situated in the County of Polk, State of Oregon, and the waters of Frazee (Nimagan) Lake, situated in Wasco County, State of Oregon, are threatened with extinction from excessive angling and from other causes; and

WHEREAS, The State Game Commission of the State of Oregon is desirous of protecting the trout and other fish inhabiting said waters;

WHEREFORE, By authority of law vested in said State Game Commission of the State of Oregon under Section 4, Chapter 275, Laws of Oregon, 1925, notice is hereby given that the waters of Fanno Creek, situated in Polk County, State of Oregon, and the waters of Frazee (Nimagan) Lake, State of Oregon, are hereby ordered, and declared closed to fishing or angling thereon in any manner, for trout and other fish, on and after the 20th day of August, 1925, and it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, or fish or angle for trout or other fish in any manner whatsoever in the above described waters.

Any and all persons taking, catching, killing, fishing or angling for trout or other fish in violation of this order will be prosecuted as by statute provided.
