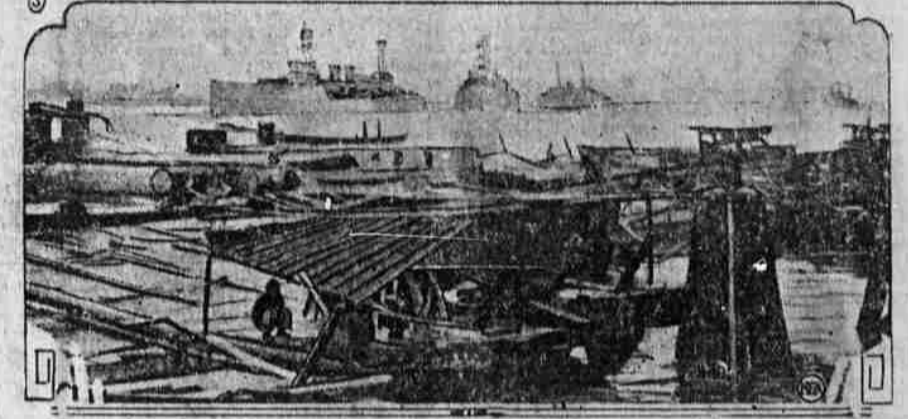
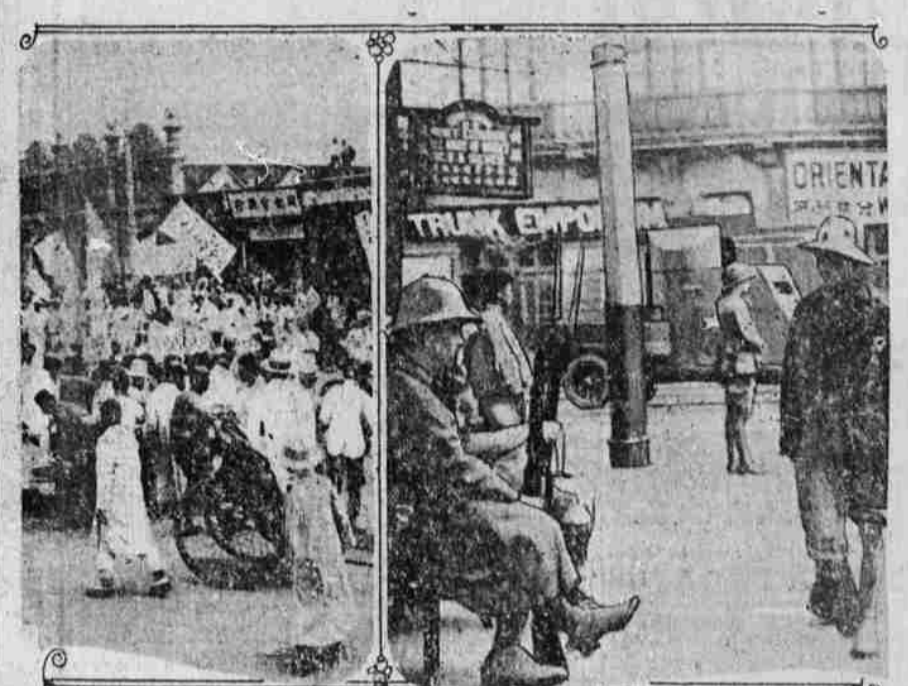
THREE KILLED; SUSPECT HELD
