LEBANON HAS BIG FIRE.

LEBANON, Ore.—The heaviest fire loss suffered by Lebanon in recent years hit the city when a fire destroyed the storage garage and second-hand store of G. B. Warner and partially destroyed the Cottage hotel owned by his sister, Mrs. Anna Gorman, a few feet from the garage. Ten automobiles and two trucks in storage in the garage were totally destroyed with only one escaping insurance.

The garage was formerly a livery barn and was a frame building covering nearly a quarter block. It was a total loss with no insurance. Mr. Warner's loss is placed at \$2000 and that of Mrs. Gorman at \$3000 with \$2000 insurance. The loss to the owners of the stored vehicles is about \$4000.

NARCOTIC MEN UNDER ARREST

CHICAGO (AP)—Col. Will Gray Beach, chief of the narcotic division of the internal revenue department for the Chicago district, an three of his trusted assistants have been arrested on charges of bartering drugs for the loot of robber gangs.

Coincident with the arrests, agents of the special intelligence unit, reinforced by more than 100 detectives, raided a score of opium joints in Chinatown and on the south side.

Arrested with Beach were Dennis J. O'Brien, Altonzo Baxter and Harry Dietrich. Other arrests will be made, said federal agents, as part of a nationwide inquiry and cleanup of alleged grafting conditions in the federal narcotic service.

Ordered By Blair

Ethel L. Ivey, chief of the special intelligence unit, who came from Washington to work with Patrick Roche, special agent here, disclosed the raids, and arrests were ordered by David H. Blair, commissioner of internal revenue, and Lincoln G. Andrews, who recently was given a free hand in enforcement matters by Secretary Mellon.

Search of the apartments of Beach and O'Brien, Ivey said, uncovered sizeable goods identified as stolen and worth thousands of dollars. Included were wearing apparel, jewelry, curios, radio sets, guns and cameras, searchlights, fans, air lamps, and night-ray machine, used in beauty parlors.

Beach came here four years ago from Philadelphia, and has acquired a reputation as a lecturer on drugs and their evils. He brought Baxter and Dietrich with him. They became, with O'Brien, an ace of long service here, the most feared of narcotic raiding squads.

Snake River Yields Body.

TRAFER, Ore.—The body of an unidentified man was found in the Snake river near Ballard landing. It was reported here. Burial was made with three other bodies of unidentified victims of the river. The man was about five feet four inches tall, heavily built and had a beard. He was about 55 years of age.

Dublin Favors Large Families

DUBLIN, (AP)—The Dublin City Commissioners, who have just completed 245 new houses for the working classes, have had 4,100 applications for the houses and have decided to allot them in accordance with the size of the families. There are 24 families of at least 12 persons each, 40 of 11 persons, and 75 of 10 persons. There are in Dublin many families of 10 persons who are living in single roomed tenements.
