

Sister Mary Says:

Breakfast—Baked pears, boiled rice, top milk, crisp broiled bacon, whole wheat toast, cornmeal puddle, cakes, maple syrup, coffee, milk.

Luncheon—Creamed celery on toast, cucumber omelet, graham crackers, tea milk.

Dinner—Lamb stew with vegetables, corn on the cob, head lettuce salad, apple snow, sponge cake, coffee, milk, bread and butter.

After other children have eaten their cereal they may have one or two carefully baked pancakes with syrup, but a child under six or seven should not be permitted to eat griddle cakes or waffles.

Creamed Celery Two cups diced celery, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 tablespoon flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 1/2 teaspoon sugar, 1 cup milk, 2 tablespoons celery stock.

Use the outer stock of celery for stewing. Put in steamer, pour over boiling water to cover and boil until tender. Remove water as necessary to prevent burning but do not use more water than will boil away while cooking. Heat butter, stir in flour and slowly add milk, stirring constantly. Season with salt and pepper and add celery. There will be about 2 tablespoons water left in the celery if it is cooked in little enough water not to need draining. When thoroughly heated, but not boiling, pour over hot buttered toast.
