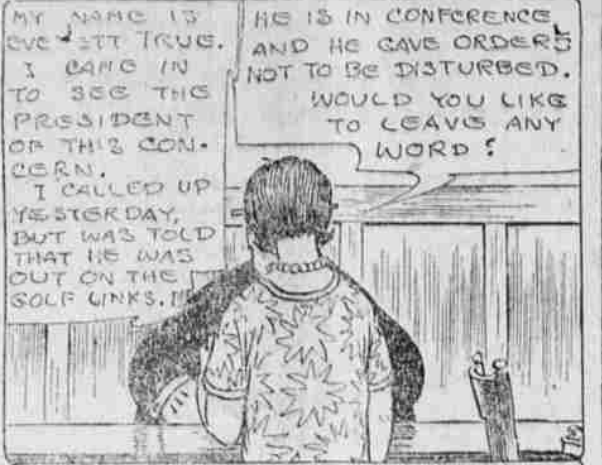

ZERBST, Germany, (AP)—The future of Germany and France to come together will signify the advance of information. The British Empire represented one group. All American politics, he asserted, aimed at the formation of a greater American group, and that America was on the right track was already shown, he thought, by the fact that to-day every sixth person in the United States is the owner of an automobile and that the majority of American squabblers are obliged to live in suburban cities, but could afford to have their home in the green country and rear rosy-cheeked children.

The third group he described as the pan-Asian group which, under Japanese leadership, was rapidly developing. As the fourth group he designated Soviet Russia which was stretching its tentacles across two continents.

"It is absurd," the general said, "for Europe, torn into 26 small states, to try to compete with four such mighty economic groups, unless means and ways were found to fuse these 26 states into a common federation."

In spite of all protests by the nationalists, I emphatically declare that the failure of Germany and France to come together will signify the suicide of Europe."

The speaker concluded with a fervent appeal for an alliance of the nations.
