**WILL REVIVE PUBLIC BATHS**

ROME, (AP)—Public baths, which constituted part of the greatness of ancient Rome, are beginning to come into vogue again with the ever growing interest in athletics on the part of Italian youth.

Inspired partly by the grandiose pompousness of the ruins of such ancient structures as the baths of Caracalla and Diocletian and partly by the practicability of modern gymnasiums, Italian architects have drawn up plans for the erection of two massive structures which are destined to serve the Roman public not only as baths but also as athletic and sport centers.

One of these is to be constructed in the Piazza Risorgimento, in the center of one of Rome's most rapidly growing residential sections according to the architect's plans it will be rivaled in splendid ornateness only by such new buildings as the Palace of Justice, at the Piazza Cavour. The new public bath establishment will contain, among other things, a large swimming pool, 60 meters by 20 meters, a large gymnasium, reading and lounge rooms and other equipment calculated to attract and delightedly delight young men.

The site for the other building now in progress has not been definitely chosen, but it probably will be located in the Esquilino quarter of the city.

**State Law Against Reckless Shooters Is Quoted by Averill**

PENDLETON, Ore. (Special)—The state law that makes it illegal for a person to use firearms in hunting who has ever killed or injured another is being violated in this county, and violators will in the future be prosecuted, according to a communication that has been received from E. P. Averill, state game warden. Mr. Averill's letter, together with his quotation of the law in question, is as follows:

"It has been reported to me that the state law prohibiting use of fire arms by any one who has killed or injured another is being violated in Umatilla county.

"As the existence of this law was unknown to myself and probably to most of the other residents of the state of Oregon, I thought it only fair to give it publicity before making any arrests. I am instructing our deputy game warden throughout the state to enforce the provisions of this law which reads as follows:

"It shall be unlawful for any person who shall have committed, with firearms of any kind or description, the crime of murder in any degree, or the crime of manslaughter, other voluntary or involuntary, or for any person who shall in a careless or reckless manner, kill or injure another with firearms, at any time after the commission of said crime, or murder or crime of manslaughter or after the said careless or reckless killing or injury to another, to carry or bear firearms of any kind or description within the state of Oregon; provided, that nothing in this act shall deprive the people of the state of Oregon of the right to bear arms for the defense of themselves and the state; and provided further, that this act shall not apply to any police officer in the discharge of his official duties, or to a member of any regularly constituted military organization while on duty with such military organization.

"Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500), or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed one year or by both such fine and imprisonment."
