### Diseases in Far East Will Be Analyzed at Medical Conference

TOKYO, (AP)—The sixth congress of Tropical Medicine, which corresponds in the Orient to the International Medical Congress of Europe, and which was organized in 1910 to promote the science of art and medicine in general in the Far East, will be held in Tokyo from October 11 to 21, under the auspices of the Imperial Government.

Problems that affect every foreigner living in this part of the world will be discussed, and the results of years of research by numbers of scientists will be brought forward for elaboration and approval. Among the more important items, which the association has made its special subjects up to the present and the practical results of which have been observed, are the prevention and extermination of malaria, the diagnosis of amoebic dysentery, the control of beriberi and the compilation of statistics concerning tuberculosis.

Since the majority of the members have been health officers they have urged the various governments to put into practice to a considerable extent the results of the society's scientific research and discussion. In 1923, at the last congress in Singapore, the council of the society recommended that each of the governments interested be invited to nominate a representative on a health-board committee, the report of which is to be heard at the coming session, in conformance with the policy of the association to have government representatives discuss particular problems at the general meetings.
