Spokane Bank Buys Bonds. CLARKSTON, Wash.—The substantial position of the financial assets of Clarkston's school district was shown in sale of \$22,000 worth of bonds last night, purchased by the Union Trust company of Spokane at a premium of \$182,40, with the interest rate at 4 1/2 per cent. There were five other bidders, the State Bank of Clarkston offering par at 6 per cent. The funds will be used to build an auditorium annex to the high school, the same to also accommodate the domestic science and manual training departments. Bids for the construction will be opened August 25.

ROAD MARKERS ARE PLACED

LEWISTON, Idaho.—At 10 strategic places on the North and South highway between Lewiston and Grangeville newly placed information signs have recently been placed by the state highway department. WOOD IN MILLION YEARS OLD

CHENEY, Wash.—Wood, possibly a million years old, has just been added to the collection of the Cheney state normal school by the geologist department. The wood was found in a deep cut of the S. P. & S. railroad, between Cheney and Fish lake. It occurred between two lava flows, associated with several feet of decayed rock and soil. Evidently such a long time had elapsed after the flow of lava that a great forest grew up, which was overwhelmed by a later lava flow, petrified and some specimens were partially petrified. Much of the material consists of roots which were not so easily consumed by the molten lava as the trunks and branches. In the railroad cut containing the wood, no less than five lava flows are exposed.
