Spitzbergen Souls Live In Comfortable Homes

BARENTSBERG, Green Harbor, Spitzbergen—Travelers who imagine Spitzbergen to be inhabited by a few rough trappers and seal hunters, living on raw blubber in wretched hovels, are agreeably surprised at the comforts and even luxuries enjoyed at the different administration buildings at Barentsburg, Longyear City and Ny Alesund. These local headquarters of the different coal companies are veritable havens of refuge to the few visitors who lack the comforts of the tourist steamers which run up to these ports during Spitzbergen's brief summer season, between July 15 and August 15.

PARIS (AP)—Writing the Eiffel Tower for advertising purposes required more than 20 miles of thick wire, 25 miles of fine. When it was first reported that the tower was to be used to display an electric advertisement, it was said that the state had consented to the scheme for the case of the tax it would receive, which in the present condition of the treasury would be welcome. Later information, however, showed that the Eiffel Tower Company is not obliged to ask for authorization for such action, having only to satisfy the Paris municipal council that no scheme could be adopted that would be in any way an annoyance to the town. The company receives a lump sum of \$20,000 francs or about \$17,000, of which the city gets ten per cent.
