

BRITISH END FREE MATCHES

LONDON (AP).—The British are about to adopt the American custom of charging admission to watch golf championships. St. Lawrence Canal Defended in Review Of Small Carriers

WASHINGTON (AP).—Although conceding that the great ocean lines, such as the Levantian and the Maritime, have their place in the shipping world, credit for carrying the bulk of the world's ocean commerce is given to the cargo liners and trunks in a review made public by the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Tidewater association.

The association made its statement in a defense of the proposed St. Lawrence ship channel project. Citing it was able to support the Levantian and Maritime type of ships would steam directly into the ports of Detroit and Chicago.

Cargo vessels devoted to freight service are given a majority rating of more than 25 feet of water, the statement said, adding that they must be small enough to enter several ports at both ends of their journey to obtain full cargo. Citing the numerous trips of steamers to New York, the statement said, the record of vessels engaged in foreign trade for 1922 shows that out of 3524 inward and outward trips 76.7 per cent were in vessels of less than 25 feet draft and 92.5 per cent with drafts under 20 feet.

The large export vessels plying in and out of New York and calling at Boston are not necessary to the success of the St. Lawrence ship channel, the association contended. "New Orleans and Galveston have reached great commercial importance though they can accommodate only light draft vessels. It is an error to assume that a 26-foot channel can be navigated only by such vessels drawing less than 25 feet. Such conditions are applicable only at entrance channels of exposed ports. Vessels drawing 25 feet navigate the 20-foot channel to Houston. In the protected waters of the Inland and St. Lawrence rivers and in the St. Lawrence and Welland canals vessels need to utilize every available inch. Small ocean ships navigate the present 14-foot St. Lawrence canal drawing 12 1/2 feet and more."

"At the ocean entrance of the St. Lawrence nature has provided depths ranging up to 260 fathoms. A 25-foot channel through the 22 miles of canal involved in the St. Lawrence development will freely admit vessels loaded to 25 feet. The large liners such as the Adriatic, Baltic, Cedric and Celtic are not expected in the Great Lakes ports any more than they are expected at Philadelphia, Wilmington, Baltimore, Charleston, New York, Jacksonville, Mobile, New Orleans, Houston, Houston and other highly successful commercial ports."

Ex-Head of Discount Bank Faces Fifth Trial

CLEVELAND (AP).—Joseph Kirby, who has faced four juries on charges growing out of the collapse of the Cleveland Discount company, which is organized virtually Kirby's estate, will go on trial here again on a federal indictment charging use of the mails to defraud.

Twice juries that sat in judgment on Kirby absconded and twice he was acquitted. In each case it was said that the defendant "went insane" to the jury, it being Kirby's contention that the same insanity, mania and "superstition" which lifted Kirby from a penniless stranger in Cleveland to the head of the \$41,000,000 concern, helped to convince the jury that he was innocent of the charges made against him.

Kirby has started in business in California, while the discount company is being reorganized by the receivers. The company was established in 1913 and \$14,000,000 of its preferred stock was sold throughout the state. Shortly after the company purchased the Rockefeller building, the name of which was changed to the Cleveland Discount Company building, which it still bears.

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP).—The "Constitucional Association of Rio de Janeiro, an organization similar to chambers of commerce in the United States is expanding a drive to increase voting in Brazil. It contains about 250,000 men 21 years and older, yet the number properly registered for voting does not exceed 150,000.
