COUNTY FILES APPEAL

OREGON CITY, Ore., (Special)—Attorneys for Clatsop county have filed notice of appeal to the supreme court following a judgment issued in circuit court directing the county to pay to Oregon City approximately \$40,000 held in trust for a result of road beds collected during the past few years. Oregon City entered a suit against the county for collection of that amount this spring on the grounds that the municipality had not received the 20 per cent split provided for by state law.

If Oregon City wins a decision in the supreme court it is pointed out that ten other incorporated municipalities may file suit and collect money totaling approximately \$400,000 from Clatsop county.

Intensely patriotic and a warm admirer of Amundsen personally, Knudsen's feelings got the better of him when the explorers landed here from the outer fjord, and he pressed them all to his breast in tears, shedding tears of joy.
