War of Shells More Barbarous Than Gas, Says French Doctor

PARIS, (AP)—The war in Mesopotamia—for it must be recognized as such now that Marshall Pétain, who is really the commander-in-chief of the French army, has been sent to visit the scene of action—has revived discussion in the Paris press whether gas ought to be used in warfare.

There seems to be no question of the state's right to use gas against individual distributors of the poison as the police have recently employed or prepared to employ gas to arrest criminals, locked in their rooms, without any protest being raised.

A prominent surgeon, Jean Louis Faure, who saw much service during the World War, writing to the

Figuro, says that the use of poison gas is extremely odd—if anything can be called odd in warfare. It atom allows a military object to be gained without excessive manure and bloodshed. "Gas does but little damage. The famous flood of gas at Ypres, the most fatal case of its use during the war, hardly made more than 200 victims, less than a few well placed explosive bombs would have made.

"Men who have been gassed, however sad their fate, were not in general, greater objects of pity than those who had been gassed, any animal, to be blind and deaf."

"War is a terrible thing, but if we have to draw a distinction between two forms of barbarity, gas barbarism is less than shell-barbarism. It is less deadly and yet more efficient."

Irish Primate Is for Prohibition on Sunday

DUBLIN, (AP)— Archbishop O'Donnell, Primate of all Ireland, has denounced the evasion which has become a custom in the drink laws in Northern Ireland and the Free State permits. The north has wholly abolished Sunday drinking. The south maintains an exemption in favor of the bona fide traveler.

"Drunkenness is not the only evil which these unworthy members of society exhibit," says the archbishop. "They have also brought with them the practice of dancing degraded dances from which decent paganism would recoil, and they are quite unshamed in looking further facilities for drink and dancing in their own towns." He advocates the closing of public houses on Sunday altogether.

PRINCE RUPERT, B. C. (AP)—A sub-tropical valley in the mountains, far beyond the track of white men, north of the trading post in the northwest territories where grass and verdure attain amazing luxuriance and flowers are unequalled for size, was described here Tuesday by Col. J. Scott Williams of Montreal, who has just returned from the first airplane prospecting expedition in the district.

Colonel Williams said a megalomaniac spent three months in the north.

The valley, which has been described by trappers and adventurers as a region of mystery because of its transplanted climate, is warmed by hot springs, so that although it is surrounded by mountains clad in eternal snow, and is in a high latitude, vegetation resembles that of regions close to the equator.

The natives, Colonel Williams said, were greatly interested in the "flying bird," and two red men and their dogs were taken up for a 50-minute flight, landing in a village five days away by trail. The Indians who took the ride are now regarded by the rest of the tribe as supermen, and treated with great respect.

Boy Routs Two Bandits; Wounds One in the Leg

ROBERTS, Idaho (AP)—With one of their members wounded in the leg and with the whine of bullets from a .38-20 rifle in the hands of Elmer Johnson straggling in their rear three unknown hold-ups headed south from here late Tuesday afternoon after ransacking the home of Ed E. Johnson, a farmer residing south of the city, and escaping with several articles of value.

Followed by two masked and robed men and with a third waiting in a car just outside, Elmer Johnson, alone in the house at the time, at first put up a fight against the pair unarmed, he said here Tuesday night.

Sliding the two men, he slipped into a bedroom, locked the door, seized a .22 caliber rifle with but

three shells in the magazine, pumped the three shots through the door, wounding one of the bandits in the leg.

Taking what loot they could quickly lay their hands on, the pair dashed from the house and into the waiting car, pursued a moment later by Elmer, who had obtained the larger rifle from another room of the house.

From the car one of the trio fired barely missing Elmer, who, as they sped away, emptied the .30-30 after them. They were too far away, however, for effective shooting, he said.
