**HARVESTING IS  
 NEARLY ENDED**

WALLOWA, Ore., (Special)—Ideal harvest weather has prevailed over this section of the country during the past week. The most of the threshing machines and combines were able to start work again Tuesday, and much grain has been taken care of during the remaining part of the week. The yields being received appears to be running about the same as that which was threshed under the rain, with the winter wheat crop yielding from six to seven to around thirty bushels per acre. The most satisfactory yields appear to be coming from the Hard Federation crops. C. A. Hunter reports a yield of about thirty bushels per acre from a field threshed last week. Mr. Hunter states that he believes this variety of wheat is very well adapted to growing on irrigated land, as it has a still more wintered up down head. It also appears to stand droughty conditions of the dry farming section very good, and produce very satisfactory yields. George C. Moore also threshed his wheat, reporting a yield of 24 bushels per acre from Federation on dry land. He also reports a yield of 24 bushels per acre from a field of 123-Hybrid.
