THIRTY VICTORIES.
 Eddie Rommel of the Athletics, the first pitcher to win 20 games in either of the majors, is positive he will win 25 and hopes to make it 30.

Winning 20 ball games in a season is some job these days. Capturing 20 is almost a prohibitive figure. Rommel has set quite a task for himself.

Last season just eight pitchers in the two major leagues managed to finish the season with 20 or more victories, four in each circuit.

Not one managed to win 30 games. "Dazzy" Vance of Brooklyn, with 28 victories, was closest, while Walter Johnson, with 22 games to his credit, led the American league.

It is a baseball truth that few pitchers have two winning years in succession. That seems to hold good relative to the four outstanding pitchers in each league last season.

The two veteran stars, "Dazzy" Vance and Walter Johnson, are the only two of the eight who are practically certain of winning at least 20 games.

The other six pitchers to win 20 or more games last season were Shantz of Cleveland, 20; Thurston of Chicago, 20; Penneck of New York, 21; Mays of Cincinnati, 20; Cooper of Pittsburgh, now with Chicago, 20, and Burleigh Grimes of Brooklyn, 21.

Some mighty tough breaks have hit several of these star pitchers of last season in their efforts to repeat.

FEW TO REPEAT.
 Carl Mays, who went from the American to the National last year, was the pitching sensation of the majors with the Cincinnati Reds. Mays hasn't pitched a ball game this year.

An injury to his arm has kept him out of the lineup all season and seriously handicapped the pennant chances of the Reds.

Cooper of the Chicago Cubs and Joe Shantz of the Cleveland Indians have been distinct disappointments. Shantz won't win half as many games this year as last.

However, there are the usual number of surprises to cope with the disappointments in both leagues.

Stanley Coveleskie and "Dutch" Reuther, two castoffs, are staging a great comeback with Washington and should reach the 20 mark in games won.

Tommy Lyons, the youthful phenom of the Chicago White Sox, at this writing has 17 wins and should have no trouble annexing three more.

Several members of the Cincinnati staff, which by its great work has kept the club in the race, are certain to finish with 20 or better wins.

It is doubtful, however, if the present season produces more than eight, or 1924 quota of twisters effective enough to win 20 or more games.
