"The Hunted Woman" Recalls Heroic Trip To Nome in Storm.

One of the most heroic narratives which has been recorded in the newspapers for many a moon—that of the men and dogs who braved the long trail from Nenana to Nome, carrying the precious serum to relieve a stricken city—is called to mind by the William Fox production "The Hunted Woman." The screen offering booked for a 3 day run at the Star today, is adapted from James Oliver Curwood's novel about the vast reaches of the Northland. In this story are depicted the constant heroic struggles of men against the seemingly insurmountable forces of nature and the final conquest, through almost super-human endurance and will, of man over raging storms and rough, ice-covered fields that impede his progress.

In this respect the film runs closely parallel to the courageous exploits of Kasson, who, despite a blizzard and a 90-mile gale, carried on to the end. That several dogs of the team died from frozen limbs is evidence of the extreme hardship which Kasson faced undaunted. How Kasson himself came through and lived is a miracle.

Sepala, another of the gallant Alaskans who comprised the relay against time and the grim hand of the stalking specter, had almost as hard a time. He covered more distance, but the storm had not yet reached his point when he ended his long travels. But the difficulties he faced were none the less tremendous, what with a team fighting madly to follow the scent of ferocious huskies, half dog and half wolf, because a gigantic task when Sepala found that his lead dog had been loose and deserted the pack. The harness twisted and broken, the straining dogs had to follow their leader in his quest for the deer, the temperature at no below; that is a snare which requires a plant of the trail to disentangle—and Sepala did.

Curwood has lived in the north, has hunted and traveled in his cold expanses. It may well be expected, then, that a story of his creation will contain stirring recreations typical of that rugged country. "The Hunted Woman" is, indeed, just that sort of thrilling narrative and should prove popular at the Star.
