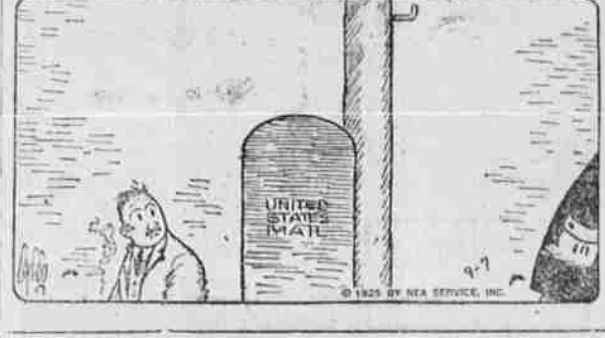

## Two Towns Lay Claim To Gibbons, Composer

OXFORD, Eng. (AP)—A forty-year-old Oxford, England, one of the most famous of modern musicians and composers, has received the old claim which both Oxford and Cambridge make as his native town.

It has long been known that Gibbons became a chorister at King's Chapel, Cambridge, at the age of 12, and that Cambridge gave him a degree in music when, at the age of 21, he became organist in the Chapel Royal, and these facts were taken as supporting the Oxford claim. By accident a chance searcher in the records of the City Church of Oxford has found an entry of the baptism of Orlando Gibbons under date of December 25, 1583, and as this name is no usual one it seems certain that the entry refers to the great church composer.

In his own time Gibbons was known more as an organist than as a composer, for he had "the best hand in England." His compositions are few, but they are declared as surpassing in dignity, propriety and beauty his contemporaries. "Oxy Clap Your Hands," "Homage" and "Almighty and Everlasting" and "Te Deum" "The Silver Swan" and "The Third and Lasted Verse" are recorded the high points of the ancient, simple and musical art of England.

## Japanese Police Issue Edict Against Short and Thin Slender

TOKYO, (AP)—Thin girls and short ones may be all right for Western women, but the Metropolitan police board has issued an order prohibiting the Japanese race from wearing abbreviated or flimsy garments in public.

The police order, which is being attacked indignantly by some of the venacular newspapers, warns all Japanese women—and especially those who are thin—that they will not be permitted to appear publicly unless fully clothed "in accordance with the most modest style" which "do not expose the limbs unnecessarily" and which are of "sufficient thickness." The police order, however, does not affect the styles adopted by foreign women in Japan.
