

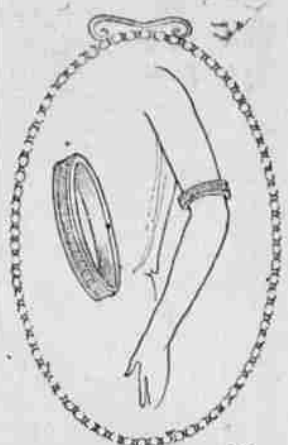

## Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary)  
 Breakfast — Steamed prunes, cereal, thin cream, crisp whole wheat toast, milk coffee.  
 Luncheon — Ham toast, lettuce salad, graham bread, oatmeal drop cookies, apple sauce, milk, tea.  
 Dinner — Broiled lamb chops, steamed and buttered rice, creamed carrots, entrée salad, creamed ice cream, sponge cake, milk, coffee, whole wheat bread.  
 The ham toast is a "left-over" made with remnants of baked ham. Children under six years of age should be served plain steamed tomatoes on toast with a poached egg topping the whole. So if there are juniors in your family you should endeavor to serve them before adding the ham.  
 Ham Toast  
 Three tomatoes, 4 eggs, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup chopped ham, 1 tablespoon minced onion, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 4 triangles buttered toast.  
 Peel tomatoes and chop. Melt butter, add onion and tomatoes and stir over fire until melted. Add ham and cook until ham is thoroughly heated. Remove from fire, and eggs slightly beaten and return to a low fire. Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens. Season with salt and pepper and pour over toast.

## Movement for Workers' College Grows in Ohio

WEST LAFFERTY, OHIO, (AP) — Public speaking, English composition, English literature, psychology, modern labor problems, and the history of organized labor are the subjects being taught in a new Workers' college which opened in this village last spring and was so successful that it was continued throughout the summer.

There are now seven such colleges in Ohio, but here is located the only one in a small community, a mining settlement. The effectiveness of the work is expected to influence other communities and industries to adopt the idea. It is understood that during the next few months, 15 new institutions of the kind are to be opened in Ohio.

Cincinnati had the first college, founded in April, 1924. The six others are at Hamilton, Springfield, Columbus, Marion, Bucyrus and West Lafferty. Toledo, Cleveland and Newark are among cities preparing to open Workers' colleges this fall.

They are fostered and directed by trade unionists, usually central labor bodies, which are endeavoring to teach wage earners the knowledge that will be most beneficial to them. The colleges are open to non-unionists as well. Propaganda is discouraged. Since the working classes are more familiar with labor halls, the colleges are generally conducted in them. The work is financed through fees from students and contributions from local unions.

Crafts and trades are not taught, that work being left to vocational schools.

The colleges have been endorsed by the national and state federations of labor, co-operating with the Workers' education bureau.

## Demand for Vanilla Enriches Residents Of South Sea Island

HONOLULU, (AP) — Prohibition in America has brought untold and unaccustomed wealth to the natives of the French mandated island of Bora Bora though an increase in the demand for and price of vanilla, which developed with the operation of the Volstead act in the United States.

Authority for the statement is Armstrong Sperry, a New York artist, who recently returned from the South Seas. He added that, paradoxically as it may seem, the new prosperity has resulted in bankruptcy for more than one native, who hitherto had been comfortably settled in life, and the mortgage of much of the island property to Chinese merchants.

"Formerly vanilla sold at three francs a pound," said Sperry, "but now it is quoted at 75 francs. This is the cause of the new state of affairs, and the raising of vanilla is the one industry—if it may be called that—of Bora Bora. The people simply plant it in a shady spot and wait for it to mature. It requires practically no care."

With the increased incomes, said Sperry, the tiny inter-island copra steamer began to bring strange and unprecedented cargoes. Occasionally there was an automobile, sewing machine, bicycle, phonograph, cases of champagne and other liquors and barrels of "colli-ton" rum. When he left, there were six automobiles in Bora Bora, which has only ten miles of road.

"There had been other machines," the artist explained, "but a number of them had been abandoned. As soon as the gasoline gives out or anything goes wrong, the automobile is left to rust away. Some are even left on the beach with the waves washing over them. But automobiling is great fun while it lasts."

The vanilla market is in San Francisco. The natives send their beans to Papeete, whence they go to the mainland once a month. The Chinese are the island merchants. They buy the beans from the natives, who will mortgage all they own on the chance of a good crop. Should the crop turn out to be a poor one, the Chinese get the land.

There are two motion picture theaters on the island, which show ancient movies of the west.

## U. S. Foreign Travel Shows Big Increase

Holy Year festivities at Rome, the apparent nearness of Europe following the war, the cheapness of oceanic travel and the increase in accommodations are variously ascribed by officials of the state department as reasons for a marked increase in applications for passports by traveling Americans.

Up to July 21, the applications showed an increase of 21 per cent over the corresponding period of 1924. The fiscal year ended June 30, 1925, recorded 168,255 Americans applying for passports, against 139,104 the previous fiscal year. At the peak of the rush season in May the department was handling about 1223 passports a day, but recently only 600 to 650 applications have come in daily. A fee of \$10 is required of each.
