When is a flapper not a flapper? This is not one of the trick questions so popular in the humorous magazines, but a serious inquiry regarding present day young womanhood. 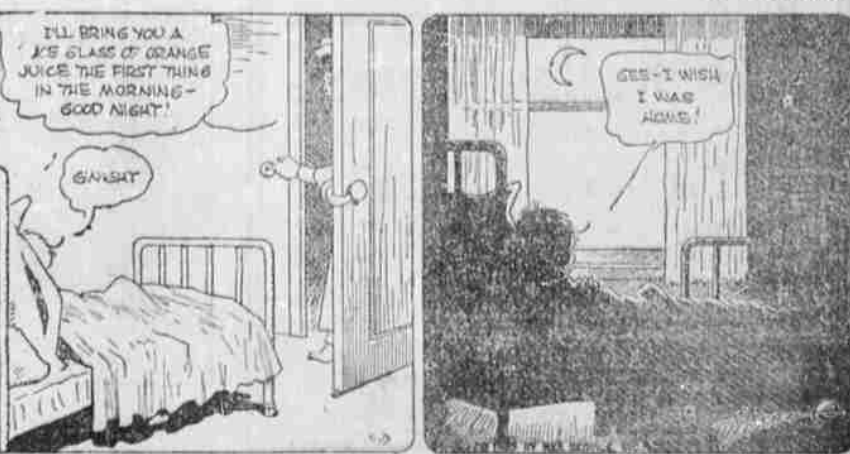
