MACK'S CHOICE.
If asked to pick the five greatest ball players in the history of the American league, Mr. Evans, whom would you select?

In matters pertaining to baseball I have the greatest regard for the quality of Collins Mack. At the (omitted) given to (omitted) by (omitted) city of Detroit on the occasion of his twentieth anniversary as an American league player, Mack speaks thusly on the subject:

"Ty Cobb is not only the greatest player in the history of the American league, but of all time. His achievements on the diamond have been so notable that I doubt if the game ever produced his equal, certainly not his superior.

"For a close second choice I would name Eddie Collins of the Chicago White Sox, a most remarkable player, who seems destined to be a great manager.

"This speaker comes next in my estimation, then Walter Johnson, followed by George Sibley.

"There you have my opinion; yours is perhaps just as good. My rating of the players is based on performance and length of service."
