TAX REDUCTIONS PLANS

The charge being made in some quarters about Coolidge-Mellon methods of tax reduction in favor of big business and against the man of moderate means does not worry the average citizen greatly. So long as there is a proportionate reduction in the income tax schedules all along the line we are not going to begrudge the rich man a saving when the comparatively poor man is relieved of part of his burden, too. If wealth can be induced to stay in active business enterprise, or return to it, and thereby furnish more work for more people, it will be a revision worth while. The extremely rich man today pays income tax rate from fifteen to twenty-five times as great as the poor man, which isn't a bad proportion. He can afford to do it. Now a reduction for everybody will be welcomed, lower taxes are beneficial to everyone, whether taxpayer or not, and the thing we are chiefly interested in is the cut in government expenses from thirty-five billion a year at the end of the war to three and a half billion this year. Now probably that figure is to be reduced one-seventh with many opportunities for improvement later on. Before the war our government expense was about a billion a year. If state, county and city can consistently follow a similar policy of economy, much of our tax burden will soon be come imaginary.

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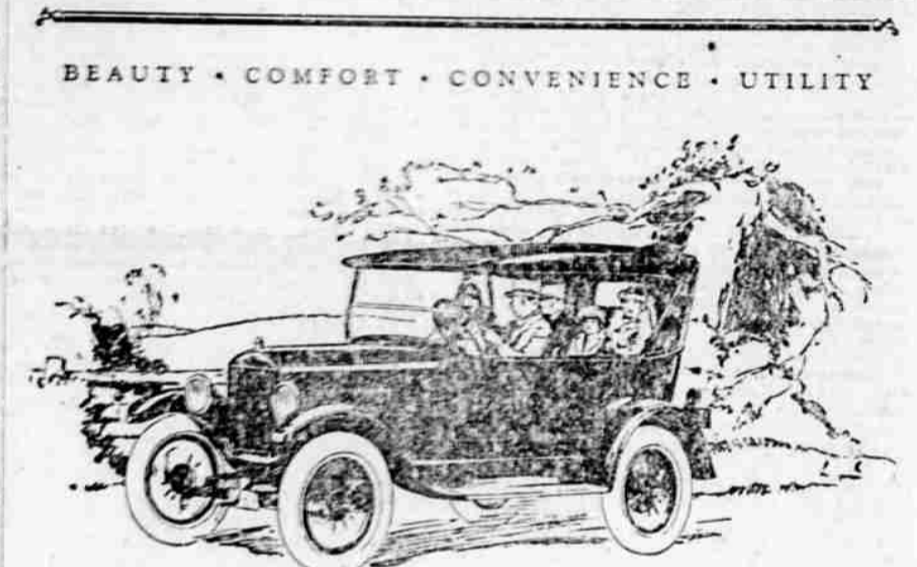
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
