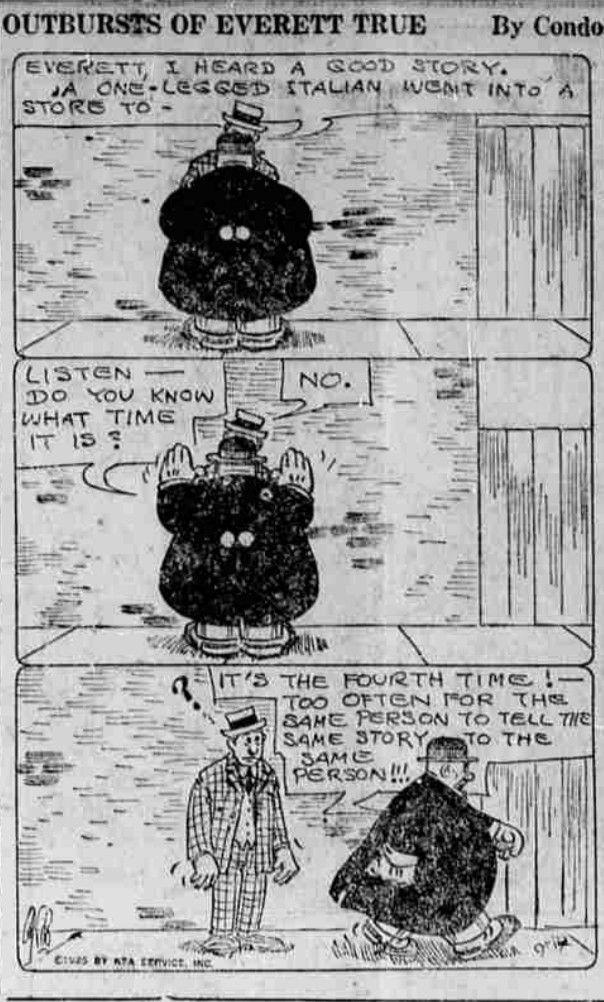

"The cast is most important in a picture," said Tom Terriss, whose latest production for Metro-Goldwyn release, "The Bandolero," is just showing today. "A director must select the actors both from the viewpoint of past performances and type. The actors make or break a picture," Mr. Terriss continued.

"The next most important point in direction is the human element. Make your characters everyday human beings, such people as will call from the audience remarks like, 'He reminds me of so-and-so' or 'Just what I would have done in his place.' That is the foundation of realism in a picture.

"Composition comes next. The director must have the ability to look at a scene and know what will make the best background. That ability might be called an artistic hunch; I certainly can't give any recipe for it.

"To sum up, I've known instances where action made a picture get over without either good photography or composition; but even the most beautiful screen compositions would fall down without a good story and action.

"The Bandolero" (The Bandit) was photographed for Metro-Goldwyn release in Cuba, Spain and the United States. The cast includes Pedro de Cordoba, in the title role, Gustav von Seyffeltitz, Renee Adoree, Manuel Granada, Gordon Begg, Dorothy Ruth, Arthur Donaldson, Maria Valney and Jose Rusda. It is based on a novel by Paul Gwynne, adapted by Mr. Terriss. Photography was by George Peters; the associate director was Rodney Hickok. It's

the various players interpret their roles with an earnestness, a sincerity and spontaneity that leaves no room for any criticism.

Cross Roads of Nation Located

At Indianapolis Street Corner

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. (AP)—A down-town street intersection—Washington and Meridian streets—is to be designated "the crossroads of the nation."

Two important national highways, the National Old Trail road, running from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and the Dixie highway, beginning at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., and terminating in Miami, Florida, intersect at this Indianapolis corner.

More than 75 per cent of the cross-country north, south, east and westbound tourists use these two highways, according to E. W. Steinhart, president of the Hoosier State Automobile association. Mr. Steinhart instigated the plan to locate "the crossroads of the nation" in Indianapolis.

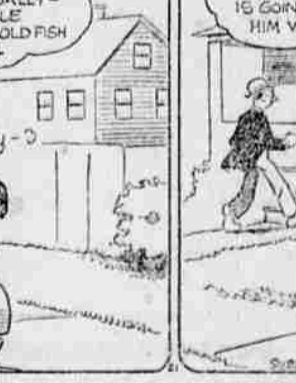

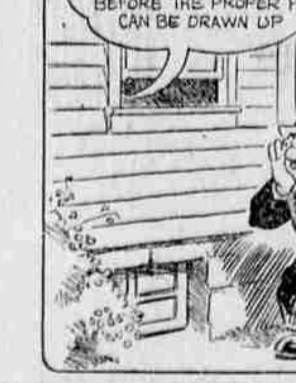
