THE OPEN COURT

CORRESPONDENTS MUST SUBMIT THEIR NAMES TO THE EDITOR IF THEY DESIRE LETTERS PRINTED.

La Grande, Ore., Sept. 29, '25. Editor of The Evening Observer: Trial of the City of La Grande versus A. W. Wall and Bert (alias George) Higgins, came up yesterday afternoon before Judge Slater. However, good and sufficient reasons were not given by said board of education and Superintendent Longfellow to show wherein said defendants were guilty of "disorderly conduct" and the case was dismissed for lack of competent evidence, and the taxpayers' money goes for "legal advice" instead of for services of another teacher as prayed for.

We are anxious to learn when, where or by what authority the said City of La Grande acquired the complete control and management of our schools.

Education is a national problem. It is the concern of every citizen. If more parents would attend school meetings, interest themselves in school affairs and the welfare of their children, we would always have qualified people serving on our board of education.

The special meeting of the board of education held Sept. 17, 1925, to confirm the transfer as ordered by the superintendent, was held illegal, in that a quorum was not present to transact business. It was frankly admitted by the superintendent that the transferring and re-assigning were made several days prior to said meeting. It was only after the parents of children affected by said re-assigning asked for a conference with the board of education that the meeting was held to confirm the transfers as ordered by the superintendent.

If the school district was re-zoned and Washington street made the dividing line, then pupils of all grades should be affected thereby and attend Willow school hereafter. A part of a postal zone does not require one thing and the other portion another.

Parents: Your child may be the next one transferred and compelled to traverse an unprotected railroad crossing, through a congested city for it is at this point on the railroad, the Old Oregon Trail highway and Cove avenue intersect down a sea of mud to Willow school.

The board of education promises that Cove avenue leading to Willow school will be made accessible to cars and adequate sidewalk provided; perhaps the city, county and taxpayer will have something to say along that line, too.

A police officer, without a warrant or authority from anyone who will admit it, came to the school house and assaulted the principal. A person who commits murder or other offense is a lawbreaker and the presence of any officer may be immediately arrested by such officer, otherwise a warrant must be issued and served on a person presumed to commit a crime.

One little boy who had his feet crossed under his desk when the officer pounced upon him, was grabbed by the arm and pulled out with such force that his arm and chest were injured and he is now under a doctor's care.

These innocent 9-year-old children committed no crime. The unwritten law gives a husband and father the right to protect his family. Yet this police officer, without authority and violently handled these children and the father watching the procedure finally tells the officer to stop it. But he commits no crime against the city of La Grande.

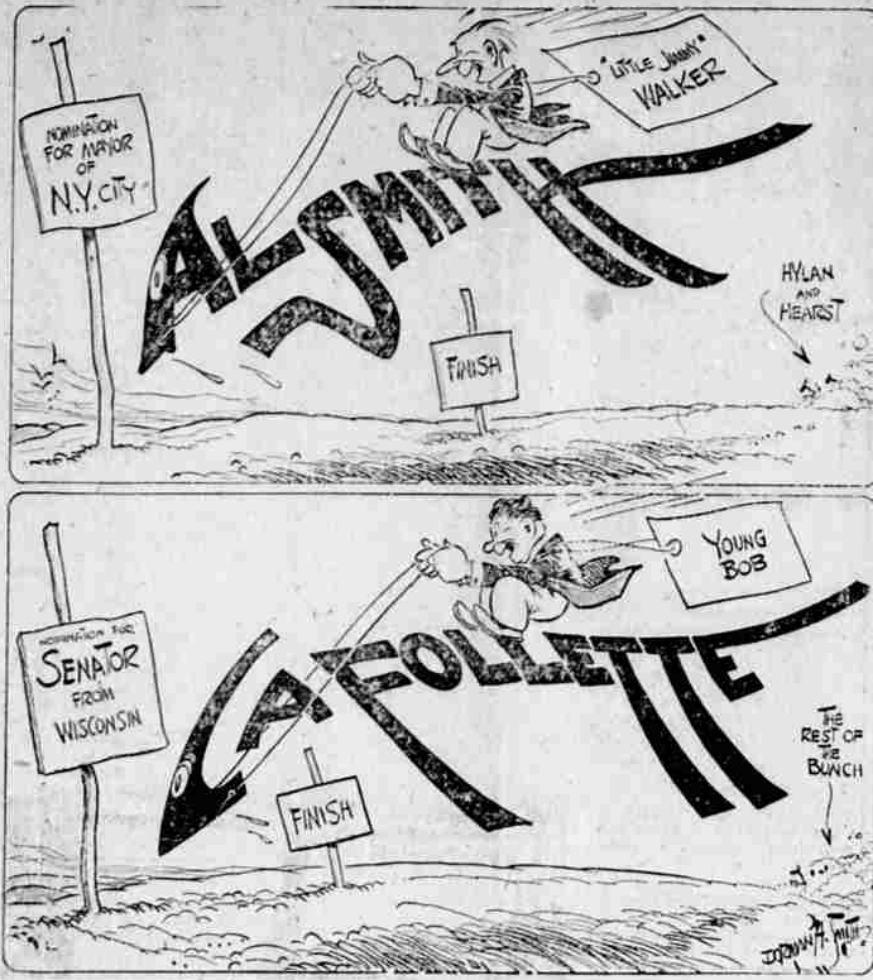
Where and who is the truant officer; why is he not handling children instead of policemen? He should be out looking up children who have not been enrolled in any school this term because their parents are unable to meet the exorbitant prices charged for school books.

Where are our inalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness when a man cannot protect his family, nor come on school grounds to protest against a great injustice done his child without being hauled into court for "disorderly conduct" which has raised no disturbance, broken no furniture, used no obscene language, nor physically injured no fellowman?

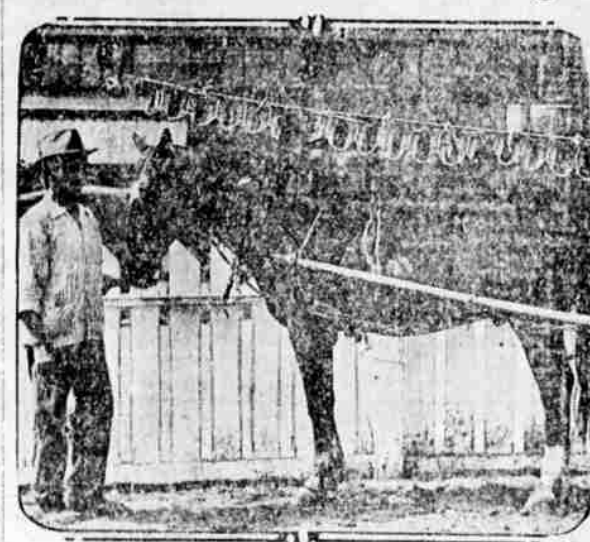

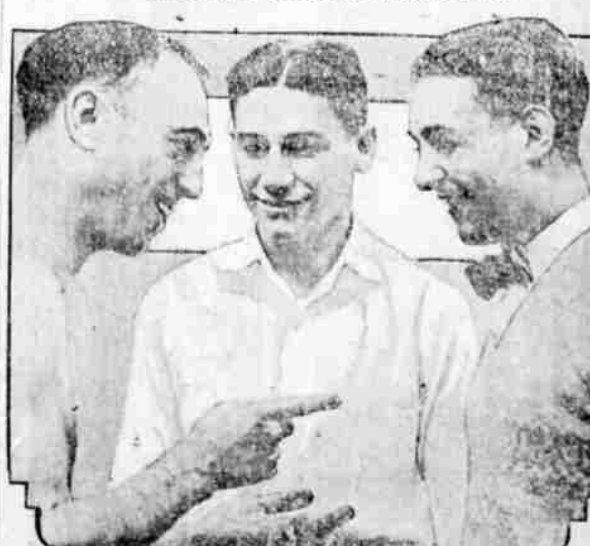

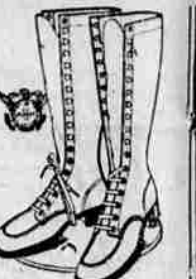
