Ben Lyon, Mary Astor Featured in New Film Thriller

An exciting automobile race, with a bull fight, a prize fight or two and a goodly share of laughs thrown in for a good measure are the chief components of "The Pace That Thrills"—a pulse-pounding and laugh-evoking First National picture which has been booked at the Arcade theatre.

True to its title the picture is declared to maintain a pace that thrills from start to finish.
