SUBSIDIES IN BAD IN U. S.

(By Charles P. Stewart) WASHINGTON (NEA Special)—A subsidy by some other name wouldn't sound so bad. So Secretary of Commerce Hoover seems to think. This country certainly doesn't take kindly to subsidies. That, according to aviation authorities, is what's the matter with American air navigation. It can't be made to pay commercially unless it's subsidized. Private capital won't go into it at a loss. The public balks at a subsidy. So it lacks. In these days of getting around this difficulty, Hoover offers a suggestion. The commerce secretary's idea is that the postoffice department should give up flying its own planes and make contracts with private aviation companies to carry the airmails, just as the railroads are paid for carrying mail terrestrially. The privately owned mail planes, he adds, could charge for transporting freight and passengers, too. Thus, in Hoover's opinion, private aviation would be put on a paying basis and would be left to itself to develop naturally. This plan might work satisfactorily. In fact, it probably would, inasmuch as Secretary Hoover thinks it would. He makes very few poor guesses. However, one of the complaints was by which governments subsidize land and sea transportation companies is through stiff financial allowances to them for carrying the mails. That, in all likelihood, is what the Hoover system, if adopted, will amount to—but the subsidy will be sugar-coated. Salem Denies Camper's Claim.

CITIES TEACH PEOPLE TO PLAY. STATES DISCLOSE

ASHEVILLE, N. C.—(By the Associated Press)—American communities are teaching their people to play. It is shown in the report of the Playground and Recreation Association made today at the national recreation congress. In 1900, only a dozen cities were making provision for recreation while now 111 communities have systems of playgrounds under direction of the public recreation movement, which was cradled in New England, has reached into all sections. At least a quarter of American cities now having year-round recreation under leadership are located on the southeast and the south is alive to a greater need.
