"Winds of Chance," Rex Beach Novel, Makes Great Picture

After years of Northwest, Mounted Police stories the real true story of Alaska has come to the screen with Frank Lloyd's "Winds of Chance," which made its local debut at the Arcade theater today, starting a four-day run.

"Winds of Chance" is one of the few pictures which might be justly termed great for any one of three reasons.

In the first place, Rex Beach, foremost writer of Alaskan development and history, is the creator of the story. Secondly, Frank Lloyd, who does big things with finesse and keen understanding of public intelligence, has visualized the story, and thirdly, he has been wise enough to give every character of his play to a capable actor, most of which are recognized stars of the first magnitude and who, as a whole, give exceptional interpretations of the author's dream people.

Trying to give any particular star in the cast credit that is not deserved by every member would be unfair. They all stand out, and "Winds of Chance" leaves one unable to pick a favorite. Unquestionably the work of Victor McLaglen as "Hobson" is the biggest purpose of the picture, for little has been heard of this splendid actor before. He had only appeared in three American films before.

Jack Hoxie Film Showing at Star Theater Today

"Ridin' Thunder," the Blue Streak Western which is playing at the Star Theater today and Thursday, is Jack Hoxie in his latest, speediest, western thriller, replete with novel situations and old-fashioned he-man romance.

Adapted from the story by B. M. Rower, "Ridin' Thunder" is an interesting tale of seasoned cattlemen in a virgin cattle country. The action of the story is laid on the border of the great Painted Desert of Arizona. Lofty grandeur and rich color of the countryside add to the interest of this story which was directed by Cliff Smith.

One of the unusual situations in "Ridin' Thunder" is a great western relay race against time. How Hoxie finally saves his father from the gallows is revealed in a series of amazing sequences.

Mathewine Grant, noted western heroine, is cast in the role of Jean Croft, the rustler's daughter in love with Hoxie. In this character she is placed in a peculiar predicament at the death of her father when she realizes that her sweetheart is the son of the accused murderer. How Miss Grant overcomes the almost impossible obstacle which tend to keep her from her beloved lover is revealed with rapidity and ability.

Others in the supporting cast who do able work are Jack Pratt, Francis Ford, George Connor, Bert Demare, William McCall and Broderick O'Farrell.

Canadian Butter Exports Swell

OTTAWA, Ont. (AP)—Exports of butter from Canada to countries of the world increased 100 per cent in the 12 months ending August 1, said a report issued by the Dominion bureau of statistics. Shipments totaled 28,869,397 pounds with a value of \$19,317,119 compared to 14,474,311 pounds valued at \$5,273,479 in the year ending August 1, 1924.

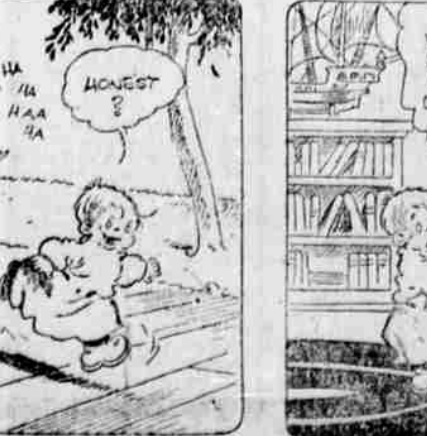
