LOURDES, France (AP)—Packed on the walls of the grotesque grotto here, Lourdes' end for 20 many pilgrims from all parts of the world, there is a placard which reads: "Look out for your pocketbook."

Above the heap of crutches abandoned by the devout in testimony of cures there, is another, and by the sacred fountain there is a third. Faith in the healing powers of the shrine brings the pilgrim, and faith in the fairness of the pilgrim's scrip has brought the pickpocket and the con-man.

Lost Record of Unanimous Vote

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. (AP)—One of Santa Barbara county's most treasured documents—a record of its only unanimous election—was partly destroyed in the earthquake.

The transcript, which had been carefully guarded for more than 75 years, related that every qualified elector residing in the county cast his vote on April 1, 1850, and the result was 50 to 0 in favor of California, entering the union and the ratification of the state constitution.
