Billy Evans Says

STRENUOUS SPORT. Football is considered a far more strenuous sport than baseball. But for a moment consider the case of Ernie Vick.
During his days at Michigan, Vick was one of the country's greatest centers. He was an all-America selection in 1921.
Unless my memory fails me, Vick lost little or no time from play during his football career at Michigan. Not once was he seriously injured. After graduation Vick, who also starred as a catcher at Michigan, cast his lot with the St. Louis Nationals.
Vick looks like an excellent baseball prospect. Injuries, however, have kept him from proving his real worth as a big leaguer. He has played only about 15 games this year.
His most serious injury was a badly shattered thumb that for a

time threatened to end his professional career.
Without a doubt football is far more strenuous and dangerous than baseball, but one could never cite the case of Ernie Vick to prove such an assertion.
LURE OF MONEY. A majority of college athletes, who shine at both football and baseball, prefer to play the former sport. Vick is no exception.
After getting out of college, Vick in the fall has been in coaching the forwards at Michigan. He loves football and naturally the coaching job, next to playing, appeals to him. Had a chat with him the other day in which football, not baseball was the chief topic of conversation. He has about decided to sever his connection with the grid game as a means of livelihood.
Vick would like to try his hand at coaching some big college eleven but says the compensation does not make it sufficiently worth while for the responsibilities of the position.
Vick, a Big Ten star, says the colleges in other sections, the east in particular, are far more generous in the matter of salary for coaches.
The professional game hasn't a great appeal to him, and since the possibilities of coaching are too limited as far as salary is concerned, Vick has about decided to expand his efforts in some other direction.
The name of Vick will live long in the memory of those who like Big Ten football. Michigan will always remember his great work.

CHICAGO (AP)—The Cubs defeated the White Sox, 7 to 4, Tuesday and won the annual Chicago city series, 4 games to 1. It was the first city title for the Cubs in three years and it was the last game for Manager George Gibson. Next year he will be replaced by Joe McCarthy, who witnessed the final game with President Veck of the Cubs.
The Cubs collected ten hits off three White Sox pitchers. Faber, Connally and Blankenship worked in order, Faber being knocked off the slab in the sixth inning. Wilbur Cooper worked the route for the Cubs, yielding only seven hits.

DEER HUNTER HITS MAN
ALBANY, Ore.—Clifford Porney of Albany was seriously wounded by a bullet fired from a gun in the hands of Virgil Peacock, about four miles above Casasita, when Peacock mistook Porney for a deer.
The bullet entered Porney's back and ranged through his right lung and arm, leaving a jagged hole two inches in diameter. Peacock carried the man to the trail nearby and went to the Casasita ranger station for help. The Lebanon ambulance was called and took Porney to the Lebanon hospital. His recovery is doubtful.
