WHAT IS A DANGEROUS COMMUNICABLE DISEASE?

(By Dr. Frederick Stricker)
This is the accepted name of a contagious disease—and is one that can be communicated by one person to another either by contact with diseased persons or through water, milk, air, clothes or any other intermediary agent whatsoever, and that may be the cause of death.

Should every citizen be able to recognize diseases?
Only in a general way. He should know the common signs, but he should never attempt to diagnose or treat. Diagnosis and treatment require expert knowledge.

What are the most dangerous communicable diseases in the state of Oregon?
Diphtheria, measles, scarlet fever, smallpox, typhoid fever, tuberculosis and whooping cough.
