Some 25 men, with the usual complement of coaches, trainers, managers, and rosters were on the special train.

With the conference season looming in the distance, it became apparent today that Coach Andy Smith had not yet definitely selected his first string eleven. Several changes this week, including the induction of a second string man to the first squad, has made many of the candidates feel shaky about the various positions.

Although Smith has made no announcement regarding the starting lineup Saturday, it is expected that the eleven will be similar to that which opened against St. Mary's last week.

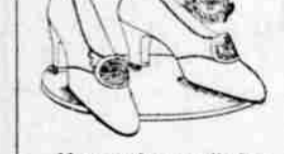
