HUSKIES HAVE CHANCE TO WIN

SAN FRANCISCO (By the Associated Press)—The football business is "looking up" in Pacific coast circles. Results of last Saturday's contests brought out rather forcibly the fact that at least three teams are going to make a mighty bid for Pacific coast conference honors.

They are, Stanford, whose 12 to 9 victory over Southern California was the surprise of the day; Washington and California. Washington, by holding the powerful Nebraska eleven to a 6-6 tie, easily entered the lists as a leading contender for the conference title.

The Bears defeated the week before by the Olympic club somewhat redeemed themselves by winning from St. Mary's 6 to 0. California plays its first conference game next Saturday, taking on Oregon at Portland. A slight breathing spell will be offered the following week when the Bruins meet Pomona.

Washington state will be the second conference opponent for California, after which another of the "big" games of the year will take place when the Washington Huskies attempt to oust the Blue and Gold. The fourth conference game for the Bears will be the "big game" with Stanford, November 21.

Having any more unfortunate upsets, such as the now famous Olympic club win over both Stanford and California, the annual contest between the two states eleven is expected to be much more of a real game than most persons were led to believe at the start of the season. Stanford's comeback, after a mediocre showing against Santa Clara, has assured that. Earlier in the season it was freely predicted that the blue and gold squad would give their greatest rival a decisive beating this year.

California's squad, the number as yet undetermined, boarded a train for Portland Wednesday night. Since there were no injuries in the St. Mary's game, the Bears should hit Oregon in fine shape. Captain Tut Inlay, out of the game through injuries at the start of the season, is expected to get into the coming contest possibly for the four full periods. He was sent in for little more than a period last Saturday and appeared to be in fine condition.
