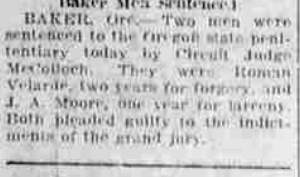

Farm Pointers

The yield of potatoes in many Oregon fields was considerably reduced this year by the rhizoctonia disease, the experiment station reports. This disease regularly takes a larger toll than any other one disease or pest. Many growers do not appreciate the seriousness of rhizoctonia damage or else do not know that it can be prevented almost entirely by two things, crop rotation and seed treatment. Potatoes should not be grown on the same ground more than once in four years. All seed potatoes, no matter how clean, should be given either corrosive sublimate or hot formaldehyde bath before planting.

Weevils in beans and peas are controlled by fumigating the seed with carbon disulphide, says the U. S. C. experiment station. Materials not held over for seed are put in shallow pans in the oven and held there for an hour at a temperature below that of boiling water. If the weevils are not killed in the fall or early spring by fumigation or heat they fly to the beans or peas in the field and lay their eggs on the green pods the following season.

Over 1,000,000 acres in the Willamette valley and more than 2,000,000 acres in the state of Oregon can be doubled in production by proper drainage, says W. L. Brown of U. S. C. Drains work both night and day in the Oregon wet season.

Growers in Oregon who plan to plant strawberries the coming season are warned by the department of entomology of the experiment station against purchasing plants infested with the strawberry root weevil. Land already infested with the weevil is best planted to grain the first year after plowing under, then vetch or clover one year, then a cultivated crop one or two years, and then strawberries again for three years. New plantings should be set with weevil-free plant and on weevil-free ground. Where the weevil already occurs in the district, the new plantings are as far away from the old plants as possible.

Full sown clover usually finds its hardest months in Oregon to be December and January, says the experiment station, as the alternate freezing and thawing are much of it so it fails to live. More than half the fall-sown clover usually dies, so with clover seed at 25 to 30 cents and the seed bed too dry for prompt germination, it is extremely hazardous to plant clover this fall.

OREGON TEAMS PLAY TODAY

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Two major games of the Pacific Coast conference will be played Saturday—California against Oregon at Portland, and the Oregon Aggies against Stanford at Palo Alto.

At Los Angeles the University of Southern California will play Arizona, Washington University will take on Whitman at Seattle, and Gonzaga will play Idaho at Spokane.

Other coast games scheduled for Saturday are: Montana against Montana Mines, at Missoula; Nevada against St. Mary's, at San Francisco; Pomona and Redlands, at Redlands; Occidental and University of California, southern branch, at Los Angeles, and Willamette and Puget Sound, at Tacoma.

Construction Camp Established KLAMATH FALLS, Ore.—Southern Pacific construction camps are now being established between Grass Lake and Weed, preparatory to starting work on the new line which was recently authorized by the interstate commerce commission. This cutoff will shorten the distance between Klamath Falls and the main line of the Southern Pacific and will eliminate a heavy grade which trains must negotiate over the old route, which once was used for a logging railroad.

RANGE SEASON LONGER PENDLETON, Ore.—Mountain range is enough better than it was last year that sheepmen expect to have the use of the larger ranges for between a month and six weeks longer than in 1924, according to local operators. The extra use applies only to privately owned or leased land. The feed has been good all season, and grass is still plentiful and spring are flowing on the higher lands.

Two Years' Sentence Given EUGENE, Ore.—H. P. McAdoo, who had pleaded guilty to the charge of larceny in a dwelling was sentenced by Judge Shipworth at circuit court to serve two years in the penitentiary. His son, Alvin, jointly indicted with him on the charge, pleaded not guilty and will be tried at this term of court. It is charged that the two men, who were traveling through the country in an old automobile, robbed a cabin on the McKenzie river.
