ISOLATED CHINESE PROVINCE GETS FIRST MOTOR ROAD
RINGCHOW, Province of Kiang, China (AP)—This central Chinese province is getting its first motor car road. For communications in the west, it has probably had the most of any of the 18 provinces. It has no railways and practically no navigable rivers. But in spite of these disadvantages travel has been fairly easy because the main route to Tibet and Turkestan leads through the province. To Young-tao, military and civil governor of the province, last year ordered his principal general to start the road work with the soldiers under his command. The general commanded each regiment to build seven miles of road. The soldiers promptly impressed the local farmers into service. A road capable of handling motor traffic for more than 100 miles has been completed.
