listed in the roll at \$2,788,199. Improvements on land not deeded are given at \$59,540.
The county has \$29,980 worth of logging roads and rolling stock, and stationary engines valued at \$253,370.

Other items list as follows: Money, \$23,560; notes and accounts, \$122,700; shares of stock, \$204,170; hotel and office furniture, \$105,820; 6632 horses and mules, \$27,420; 15,770 head of cattle, \$384,975; 12,743 head of sheep, \$76,855; 225 bee stands, \$580; 2152 swine, \$26,500; 156 dogs, \$1500; 35 foxes, \$2600; chickens, \$2600; transient livestock, \$32,910.
