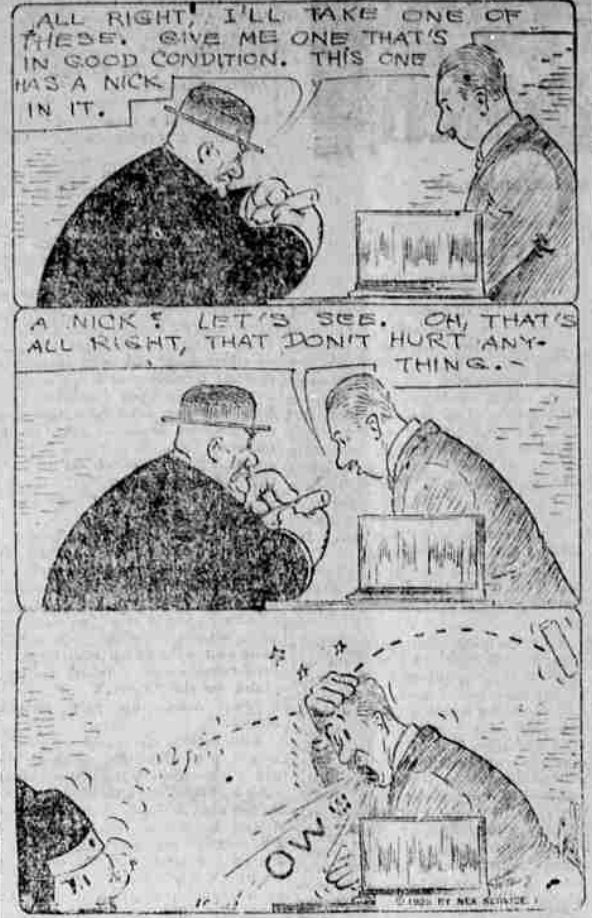

**"He Who Gets Slapped"**  
 Proves Film Of Great Appeal  
 One of the most appealing and tragic stories ever filmed, with all of the director's delicate artistry at its best.  
 That is the verdict on "He Who Gets Slapped," Victor Seastrom's second American picture, showing at Sherry's last time tonight.  
 Adapted to the screen from the play by the noted Russian author, Leonid Andreyev, "He Who Gets Slapped" presents a tragic intense story of an unhappy clown. The picture is set in the colorful locale of a European circus. The choice of Victor Seastrom, the Swedish actor-director, as the maker of this story, was particularly fitting, and he has made what is undoubtedly his greatest picture of it.  
 Lon Chaney gives many faces at one's heart-strings in his portrayal of "He," the unfortunate clown, and easily surpasses his other great roles.  
 The story, in short, is of an obscure scientist who moves away for years on his theories, proves them, then, as his life work is stolen by him, becomes "He Who Gets Slapped," a circus clown. His life in the circus, his unspoken love for the beautiful circus rider, and the final sacrifice of his life to save her from marriage to the very man who had ruined him years before, forms the basis of the story.  
 The story is a tragic, but not an unhappy one, and Chaney makes of the unfortunate clown a most appealing character.  
 Norma Shearer adds another triumph to her list as the girl of the circus, and John Gilbert, as the romantic lead, does creditable work. Excellent character portraits are drawn by Tully Marshall, Marc

McDermott, Ford Sterling, Clyde Cook.
