CARDS ON WAY TO SEATTLE

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)—Stanford University is to have a slight edge in weight over the University of Washington football team in the gridiron tussle in the stadium here Saturday, a comparison showed here today.

The Cardinal eleven is expected to average 182 10-11 pounds, while unofficial figures give Washington an average of 181 2-11 pounds.

Stanford's line will average 154 5-7, while Husky forwards will average 152.

Cardinal backs average 179 1/2 against the Washington average of 177 1/2.

Ernie Nevers, Stanford captain, is to be the heaviest man in the kickoff lineup. His weight was announced as 200 pounds. Walden Erickson, Husky tackle, will be the heaviest man on Washington's line with 194 pounds.

A complete change in Husky training work for Saturday's contest was made yesterday when Coach Ernest Bushaw ordered the varsity to scrimmage against the super-varsity squad. This was expected to be repeated today.

The Stanford eleven has left Palo Alto for Seattle. Coach Warner is bringing 24 men and is expected to arrive here today and take one workout at the stadium before the game.

URBANA, Ill. (AP)—The Pacific coast is anxious to get a "hook" at Red Grange in action as a college star. Announcement was made Thursday that a game with Illinois was being sought for the annual New Year's day battle in the Rose Bowl at Pasadena. Grid Star Says That He Dislikes the Game

BOSTON (AP)—George Owen Jr., one of the greatest of Harvard's recent football backs, does not like football. The famous gridiron star, who won nine major sport letters from 1920 to 1923, who captained three varsity teams and who was generally considered all-American halfback, explains his attitude toward the sport in an article in the current issue of The Independent, released for publication Thursday.

Owen believes that the majority of players fail to enjoy the game, deplores the attitude of alumni and suggests that the gridiron combat of ancient Rome may have its counterpart in modern football.

"The real reason for my dislike of football and I think the dislike of many other players, lies primarily in the terrible grind necessary to keep in the running," Owen writes. "The possibility of failure preys on the mind of the player that his capacity for enjoyment of the game is, in many cases, completely lost."

Owen recalls the blotting of the coach who wins and the immediate adverse criticism he suffers with a reverse.

"College football," Owen concludes, "has grown to such colossal proportions that it could hardly be a game played for sport alone, but rather a stern and relentless business."
